

Fourth Sunday of Advent

We are once again at the fourth Sunday of Advent, and we have for our first reading, a prophet who was in Jerusalem, (which was located in the Southern Kingdom). This was the period of time when the Northern Kingdom had been invaded by Asseria and the people had been taken away, most of whom would never be heard from again. Micha, the prophet, was not from the city of Jerusalem, he was from a smaller city not far from the city in the countryside. He had preached against the leaders of the time and was not likely liked at all. But again in today's reading, similar to last week, we have the future prophecies of salvation. Micha speaks about two cities, Bethlehem-Ephrathah which were small and insignificant cities; even in Jesus' time they had a total population of around 300 people according to WF Albright. And evidently in Micah's time they were also small cities, even though it was some 600 years earlier. But what had made Bethlehem so significant? Bethlehem was the city from which came Jesse, the father of King David, the most famous ruler, and a messiah. David had lived about 200 years earlier than Micha. As we see, Micha is looking to the past and recognizing that the future also holds a time when a future messiah, king will once again come and restore Judah to its former glory, and "one, whose greatness shall reach the ends of the earth."

If we now turn to our Gospel, Mary is pregnant with Jesus, and she has traveled roughly 60 miles to the hill country just east of Jerusalem. As she is arriving, Mary's voice reaches the ears of her cousin Elizabeth, and at that moment, the infant in her womb leaped for joy! The word infant literally means one who can not speak, but evidently he can surely jump. To connect this with our first reading, this is also the same hill country where King David had left the Ark of the Covenant, some 800 years earlier at the house of a man named Obed-edom. While the Ark was in the presence of the house of Obed-edom, it was being blessed. Now, when King David heard about this, he went and retrieved the Ark. As David brought the Ark up to Jerusalem, the King had danced for Joy, as it says "with all his might." So may the Joy of Our God come to each of us, not only as we hear of Him, but as we become aware of the blessings He brings when we are in His presence. May His gift to us be fulfilled in all of us this coming Christmas Season.




