From the Rastor

"It is the Spirit that gives life; the flesh cannot help. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life." Through these words Jesus speaks about his resurrection to the Jews who refused to accept his doctrine on the Eucharist. By this the Lord wants us to understand that we should not have a purely materialistic way of approaching the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the body or flesh of Christ; but it is also the body of the risen Lord transformed by the Spirit; it is the spiritual and glorified body of Christ that acts in us spiritually, unites us with God, and thereby endows us with divine life. Therefore, the Sacrament of the Eucharist becomes an effective means of communicating eternal life to us because of Jesus' words and his Spirit.

Many of his listeners find the Eucharistic mystery completely incomprehensible. Jesus Christ requires his disciples to accept his words. That is what the supernatural act of faith involves. That act "whereby, inspired and assisted by the grace of God, we believe that the things which he has revealed are true; not because of the intrinsic truth of the things, viewed by the natural light of reason, but because of the authority of God himself who reveals them, and who can neither be deceived nor deceive" (Vatican I, Dei Filius, chap. 3).

When the Jews and even many disciples find it difficult to accept Jesus' teaching and walk out on him, Peter confesses the true faith, in the name of those who remained. A true disciple of Jesus is the one who discovers in the person of Jesus and in his teaching the words of eternal life, and who clings on to Jesus forever.

Jesus says that we cannot accept this mystery if we think of it in a very human way, in other words, by just seeking to indulge our senses or having too earthbound a view of things. Only someone who listens to his words and receives them as God's revelation, which is "spirit and life", is in a position to accept them.

Jesus had outlined a wonderful and salvific truth, but those disciples closed themselves to divine grace; they were not ready to accept anything which went beyond their very limited horizons. The mystery of the Eucharist does call for a special act of faith. St John Chrysostom therefore advised Christians: "Let us in everything believe God, and gainsay him in nothing, though what is said be contrary to our thoughts and senses. Let us act likewise in respect to the Eucharistic mysteries, not looking at the things set before us, but keeping in mind his words. For his word cannot deceive" (St. John Chrysostom, *Hom. on St Matthew, 82*).

Staying with Jesus is always a decision. The disciples who left could not hack the consciousness shift. They were not ready to eat the food that the "bread" who "came down from heaven" had prepared. Then twelve stayed because they were already eating. The words of Jesus had communicated to them eternal life. Therefore, they went through a process of coming to belief and knowledge. If Jesus could give them eternal life, his origins must be in God. He is of heaven, not of earth, the Holy One of God, the descending Son of Man. Although it is not finished, the consciousness shift of the Twelve is well under way.

We will accept garage sale donations through Labor Day.




