

Friends,

We're blessed with a lot of "stuff" here at St. John Bosco, but sometimes we can have so much "stuff" that we don't realize the really important "stuff" we have.

In cleaning closets and drawers and shelves, I discovered that we have quite a few relics of the saints. Relics are objects or articles that either belonged to the saints, were used by the saints, or in some cases, fragments of the saints themselves. Historically, these have served as a memorial to the saints and in Catholic culture, they are often venerated and in prayer, we ask for the intercession of that saint.

On the Holy Family side altar, you'll see a relic of St. John Bosco as we prepare to celebrate his feast day on January 31. Fun fact: This was the first parish in the world named for St. John Bosco and we actually have two relics of our namesake. You'll see a reliquary on the side altar during this stretch of Ordinary Time before Ash Wednesday and there is also a reliquary in the front "porch" room of the rectory, with St. John Bosco facing Columbia Ave.

Likewise, inside the Holy Family altar, we have relics of St. Theodore of Amasea, a Roman general and martyr, as well as St. Theophila, but I have to do more research on her.

In the Parish Office, the former convent chapel high altar has relics of St. Donatus and St. Felix, though, again, more research has to be done to determine which Donatus and which Felix they were.

During the next few weeks, feel free to stop by the Holy Family altar and say a prayer. There is a kneeler there before the relic of St. John Bosco. May he and all the saints continue to be examples of what it means to truly live out our Catholic faith.




