


I was watching TV the other day and they were talking about a trend called "Meatless Mondays," where people adopt a meatless diet every Monday to help lower cholesterol and provide other health benefits to humans and also to animals.

I want to encourage you to consider adopting this in your own household, but instead of Monday, do it on Friday. You see, we Catholics pretty much invented abstaining from meat one day a week. And, for generations, we fasted from meat on Fridays out of penance. In those early days, meat was a luxury for most families and so eating simple meals was penitential. Even eating fish was penitential, because, by-and-large, eating fish meant cracking a can of salmon and making salmon patties or adding a can of tuna to macaroni. That is, until we figured out that lobsters weren't exactly sea monsters and if you cooked them correctly, they were actually a delicacy, but I digress.

While some of our well-intentioned brothers and sisters believe the Second Vatican Council got rid of the tradition of abstaining from meat, it did not. Canon 1250 states that the "penitential days and times in the universal Church are every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent." Canon 1251 also says, "abstinence from meat, or from other food as determined by the Episcopal Conference, is to be observed on all Fridays, unless a solemnity should fall on a Friday. Abstinence and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday."

What that means, as determined by the U.S. bishops, is that if you aren't going to abstain from meat, you should do some other act of penance. So, what weekly good deed or self-denial are you prepared to start practicing? It's all part of our path toward becoming saints.
