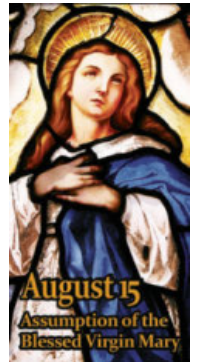

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

August 10, 2025
19th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Luke 12:32-48

This week, the Lord tells us, **“For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be” (Luke 12:34).** Our lives revolve around what we treasure. When we discover the treasure the Father gives us—the kingdom of God—everything changes. We might not know its precise value, but we rearrange our lives around it. The joy of this discovery should never be far from our minds.

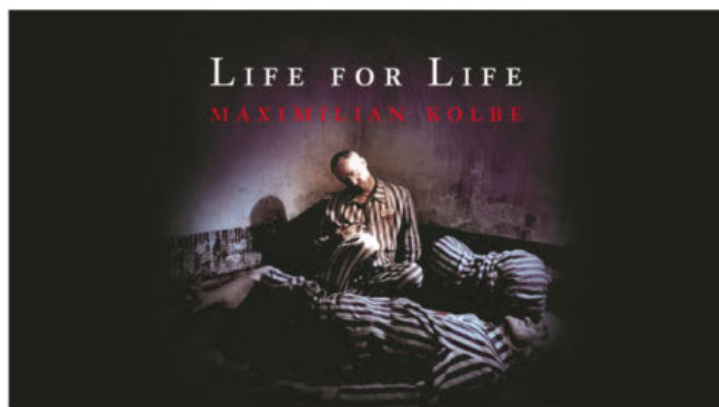

A Note from Fr. Jeff

Friends,

In the seventh grade, I learned how to play the euphonium, a low brass instrument that looks like a small tuba and sounds like a trombone. I played in the school's concert bands until the end of my sophomore year, when it just became too difficult to schedule music into my academic schedule. Still, I loved playing and once I was in college, I decided to buy a used one and play just for my own personal enjoyment.

At the same time, I was discovering the joy of parish ministry, as a lector, usher and cantor. I decided that maybe that old horn might somehow be used to glorify God. I would end up playing three Masses every weekend for the next seven years, until I ultimately entered the seminary.

God plants gifts in us that at the time, we have no idea we have and no way of knowing how they might be used to glorify him. In Luke's Gospel today, we hear one of my favorite passages: *For where your treasure is, there also your heart shall be.*

I want to thank all of you for so generously sharing your treasure with us here at St. John Bosco. For a few months now, I've been asked by a number of folks about when the Precious Blood will return to the 4 pm Saturday and 7:30 am Sunday Masses. The answer is, simply, when we have enough volunteer ministers come forward. Next Sunday, we'll have ministry sheets available at the Welcome Table after Mass for those interested in serving as Eucharistic Ministers. My hope is that enough ministers will come forward and we can offer communion under both species at all of our weekend Masses by year's end.

Another ministry that is vital for the future is the ministry of promoting priestly vocations. In talking with Fr. Ivan, we're adding on page 4, a weekly point of encouragement to consider the priesthood as a viable option for a happy, healthy life. Both Fr. Ivan and I are convinced that God is at work in our young people, and that the seed of a priestly vocation is planted in the hearts of a number of young men in this parish and in our schools. While this weekly point-to-ponder is great, we need to pair it with something active. So, I've thrown the ball into Fr. Ivan's court to consider forming some sort of vocations ministry here at St. John Bosco and Bishop Noll. Maybe it's a Vocations Cross or Vocations Chalice program. Maybe it's something else. If the spirit is moving you to join in this effort, reach out to him. Maybe that's the gift you can offer.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Clare of Assisi | August 11

As a teen in Assisi, Clare learned of a priest named Francis. After hearing him preach, she decided that her calling was to "live for the Gospel." She admired how Francis lived — in poverty, community, and service to the poor.

After receiving permission from the bishop of Assisi, she left her family join Francis and his followers. Once with them, Clare left her fancy life behind, donning a plain robe, simple veil, and cutting her hair short, a symbol of her desire to reject marriage and live a religious life.

Studying early on with the Benedictines, she was joined by her sister. Later, Clare and Francis established the Order of the Poor Ladies of San Damiano.

Daily Mass, adoration, and the Eucharist were integral to the lives of Clare's Poor Ladies.



(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC

Q: Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

A: Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
