
Anointing of the Sick

From The Pastor

Growing up in a home of three boys we were constantly looking into the fridge for something. I often remember my mother asking us boys what we were looking for and I would often answer, "I don't know." Much of our lives we spend looking for something we don't really know what it is or where to really look.

What do you want? This could be quite a simple question as well as a very complicated one. The desires of the heart can be very fleeting as well as very intentional. The question that prevails is not simply, "What do I want?" but "Where do I look to fulfill these desires?" As we continue to navigate the challenging reality of our current environment, including COVID, I find it quite challenging to stay focused on not necessarily what it is that I truly desire but where best should I look to fulfill these desires.

In our Gospel, for the last weekend of the Christmas season, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. Our Gospel begins with "the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts." The question they were asking was, "Who is the Christ?" and they were looking to John the Baptist for the answers. 
