Offered the first Tuesday of month during Mass. Also offered any other time it is needed, including if you are preparing for a serious surgery.


Marriage

Pope Francis' Address on the Eucharist (Continued). "It is very important to return to the basics, to rediscover what is essential, through what we touch and see in the celebration of the Sacraments. The question of the apostle Saint Thomas (cf Jn 20:25), to be able to touch and see the wounds left by the nails in Jesus' body, is the desire to be able in some way to "touch" God to believe in Him. What Saint Thomas asks of the Lord is what we all need: to see and touch Him to be able to recognize Him. The Sacraments encounter this human need. The Sacraments, and the Eucharistic celebration in a special way, are the signs of God's love, and privileged ways to encounter Him.

So, through these catechesis that begin today, I would like to rediscover with you the beauty that is concealed in the Eucharistic celebration, and that, once revealed, gives full meaning to the life of each person. May Our Lady accompany us in this new stretch of the road. Thank you."

The dependency is then expressed with our particular recognition of the areas that we need our God's help, His healing, His strength, His peace, His Love. We need, always. God is the one who provides for this need. Let us form our prayer to truly express this truth.

This month we recognize this need in a real way as we turn to the Lord in our Prayer through the Blessed Mother. This month of the Rosary is a truly perfect time to learn how to bring our needs to our Lord in prayer, not as someone who is simply demanding things from our God, but surrendering them to Him and being free in our weakness. The Rosary is a beautiful way to pray, not simply recite words to our Lord out of our need. I encourage all to pray to Our Blessed Mother through the Rosary. The first step is to learn how to pray the Rosary. There have been inserts in the bulletins. I encourage you all to pray the Rosary at least once a week to get started. You can also pray a decade or 1 our Father and 10 Hail Mary's. There are also great resources that include meditations for each mystery that are helpful with prayer and the Rosary.

No matter where we are in our journey of faith we could use help in surrendering our weakness to our Lord. Let us begin by with this beautiful devotion, the Rosary.
