

**Next Sunday's Gospel Reading**

You are encouraged to cut and post this Gospel, praying it daily and using it as quiet reflection.

**A reading from the Holy Gospel According to Mark**

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: *And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel.*" Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way. The Word of the Lord.

Encourage deeper understanding of Scripture

December 27, 2020

**The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph**



Tragedy and disappointment are inevitable. What sees you through this? There will be challenges, changes, unexpected circumstances, interrupted plans, hurts, and injustices experienced by every human being at some point in their lives. We will be asked to adjust our plans, change course, and even encounter suffering and death. Where do we learn all of the lessons we need to live life well? Some of them we learn along the way but much of what we bring to life, positive and negative, comes from our early beginnings, our families. This is our early world and provides the blueprint for how we see the bigger, more inclusive world, which unfolds before us.

Our families of origin can be sources of grace, heartache or a combination of both. Families are intended to be pivotal in providing us with proper social structure and understanding, a support system, lessons about relationships and communication, and the unconditional acceptance and love we so desperately crave. They can also determine whether we have an accessible and healthy relationship with God. Many of life's challenges can literally bring us to our knees and require that we possess a strength of character that resides well beyond the superficialities of our world. At some point we will all need three coping gifts that can be given to us only by God: faith, hope, and love. Our families help us learn that we are not the ones responsible for their creation, but God!

Our experience of early family life colors all of our relationships and what we expect to achieve from life in general. Resolving conflicts, dealing with difficulty and suffering, celebrating accomplishments, prioritizing our needs, listening to God's call, understanding relationships, understanding disappointment, learning about the virtues and living a centered focused life are all lessons our families either succeed in teaching or do not. To succeed, as God has designed and ordered our world, is to discover his presence and then trust that Presence. The Holy Family can teach even the most dysfunctional family how to best use God's gifts of faith, hope, and love to find him and do his will. 


### Attention All Liturgical Ministers


### Christmas and End-Year Giving

#### Did You Know . . .

On March 27, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was signed into law. The CARES Act increases tax deductions for charitable donations for both individuals and corporations for tax year 2020. You may wish to consider the following provisions when determining your charitable giving this year:

- ◆ **Individuals who do not itemize** their tax deductions may take a new “above the line” charitable deduction of \$300 per taxpayer (\$600 for a married couple). An “above the line” deduction reduces a donor’s adjusted gross income and thereby reduces taxable income.
- ◆ **Individuals who do itemize** may deduct donations up to 100% of their 2020 AGI, up from the previous limit of 60%.
- ◆ **Corporations** may deduct up to 25% of taxable income, up from the previous limit of 10%.

To qualify for these special deductions, contributions must be made during tax year 2020. Payments on outstanding pledges also qualify, provided the payment is made in 2020.



## Pastoral Care Office Update

Out of an abundance of concern for the safety of our vulnerable elderly population and following guidelines from area hospitals, as well as CDC recommendations, we are suspending our Pastoral Care Outreach ministry, except for end-of-life care. These include:

- Hospital visits*
- Facility visits*
- Home Visits*
- Care Team Visits*

We will be making follow-up phone calls to offer connection and protect against isolation. Please continue to list St. Albert the Great as your parish if you enter the hospital for care and support in your time of pastoral need.

### Sacraments

Weddings and Funerals, we will work with families to limit attendance according to the most recent guidelines for such events.

### “Prayer to the Virgin Mary” from *Priests for Life*~


