



Encourage deeper understanding of Scripture

February 7, 2021

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time



If I only knew then what I know now, how different life would be. This sentiment, expressed in myriad ways, is found on every human being's lips at one point or another. Life may have brought us to a vulnerable place where we see some of the poor choices we made and the effects they are having. Perhaps we fell into some destructive and dysfunctional relationships or behaviors and are finding how they held us captive. Our zeal and passion for life may have drifted away and we are waking up to the reasons apathy has taken hold. Life can be hard. In fact, some would describe their lives as a drudgery. They walk through each day with an anxious unsettledness, wondering when their restlessness will cease. There is a temptation to believe that what I see is all I will get. Mortality and hopelessness await the dawn. If I could only have known what would come in the future, I could have made better choices and avoided all of this misery!

Really? While we can certainly give into weakness, sin, impulsiveness, and idiosyncrasies that cause us to stumble over ourselves, life is really a journey. If we don't make the mistake of wallowing in the mire of self-pity and realize the new life God is calling us to, then there are thrills, adventures, surprises, and soul-searching graces we can surely miss. We are not tethered to our past nor are we bound to the ills life can bring upon us. We are never hopeless or helpless. The problem is that our myopic vision only allows us to see the misery and misfortune that is before us, not the potential that can come from choosing healthier and more life-giving options. Jesus came that we might have fullness of life. We need to learn how to reach for Jesus' hand and let him help us to our feet.

We need to allow God into our pain and heal our past. We have to wrestle with our histories, agonize and search and cry out for the Divine healing we need to restore our faith, hope, and love. Job could not see how his story would end or trust the guidance of the God who called him. We live in that same blindness and suffer from the same lack of confidence. Once we allow ourselves to be touched by God's healing power, we begin to see that all of the pieces of our lives are necessary parts of a greater whole. Along the way of our lives, God uses our omissions and failures to create new things and possibilities. When doors close, others open and we can be amazed by the joyful and unexpected surprises we receive. Once we know the power of God's creative, healing, life-giving, forgiving, and dynamic presence, it is no wonder we want to put ourselves at the service of others and show them what life can be. ©LPi

Check Your Spam Folder


Many people are not receiving our parish emails from Msgr. Heiar. Long term, email communication will be the most common way

Last week we listed the current top needs for *Pregnancy Helpline*, which included the following: **baby wipes; storage bins w. lids; diapers size 6; toddler clothes; industrial-sized food film.** You are welcome to donate items or financial assistance at any time to *Pregnancy Helpline*. Their needs constantly fluctuate as goods are donated to their center, and items are provided to mothers and infants in need. As a means to assist with the donation process, we will be hosting two drop-off dates here at St. Albert the Great in the near future. As you consider what you might want to donate, please refer to the following lists of **acceptable** and **non-acceptable items**:

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: Diapers and Pull-ups for Diaper Bank (open packages are welcome!) MOST NEEDED DIAPER SIZES are 4-6; New and used baby clothes, newborn to size 5T; Wipes; Formula; Equipment—including: strollers, swings, potty chairs, high-chairs (must have straps); New and used pack-n-plays; Maternity clothes; Books and baby toys; Baby shoes, bottles, bibs, blankets, crib sheets; Stamps; Paper bags; Industrial food seal-wrap to bundle diapers.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS: Car seats and car seat bases; Cribs and Crib bumpers; *Rock 'n Plays*; Baby food; Items that are excessively old or worn, ripped or stained; Clothes larger than size 6 or non-maternity adult clothing; Damaged/broken items or items with missing pieces. From the USCCB Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities we receive this meditation on the sacrificial and loving choice made when a woman chooses to offer her child for adoption:

Mothers placing their children for adoption often face many challenges along the way. One of the greatest obstacles can be inaccurately perceiving adoption as abandonment. But mothers who make an adoption plan for their children are not abandoning their children. Rather, they are exemplifying the sacrificial love of Christ on the Cross in choosing to do what is best for their children, even at great cost to themselves. Like Christ, they pour out their bodies and souls for the sake of another. The Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that, in the face of fears and trials, we can “hold fast to the hope that lies before us. This we have as an anchor of the soul, sure and firm” (Heb 6:18-19). We pray that each expectant mother choosing adoption will be filled with “the peace of God that surpasses all understanding” (Phil 4:7) as she makes a loving choice for her child. Let us all cling fast to the anchor of hope, for we have received “a spirit of adoption, through which we cry, ‘Abba, Father!’” (Rom 8:15).

Let us continue to pray for the end to abortion, euthanasia, infanticide, assisted suicide, and contraception; and the healing of all who have been affected.

How To Celebrate the Holy Mass Virtually

The key to celebrating Mass virtually is to become an active participant. We want to be fully present and engaged while celebrating Mass. Here are some simple suggestions to help actively participate in the Mass at home:


- 1) Read, reflect, and discuss Scripture readings prior to Mass as a family.
- 2) Prepare a home altar around the area where you watch Mass at home. Place a cloth around the table reflecting the current liturgical colors. Place candles and a crucifix on your home altar.
- 3) Get dressed in a respectful way and turn off any other distracting technology. Place all of your attention on the Mass.
- 4) Participate in the traditional postures of Mass such as sitting, kneeling, and standing.
- 5) Respond and pray during the correct times throughout the Mass.
- 6) Although we are unable to receive the Precious Body and Blood of Christ sacramentally, we should offer up an Act of Spiritual Communion.

Although they may not be perfect, by taking these simple steps those at home share in the communal prayers and intentions of the faithful worldwide, and look forward to the day they are able to participate physically in the Holy Mass again.

Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

The Audacity of Holiness

Do you know a holy person? I’m not talking about piety — that’s important, too, in its own way. But right now, I’m speaking of holiness.

St. Therese of Lisieux called holiness “a disposition of the heart that makes us humble and little in the arms of God, aware of our weakness, and confident — in the most audacious way — in His Fatherly goodness.”

The holy person sees a storm on the horizon of life, and rather than give themselves over to fear and despair (natural and understandable reactions), regards the gathering winds as an opportunity to rely more fully on God. The holy person takes a bad situation and sanctifies it with charity and understanding that defies our fallen human nature.

Peter’s mother-in-law was still in the throes of a fever when Jesus grasped her hand. It wasn’t until she took his hand and allowed him to help her up that “the fever left her and she waited on them.” Before the fever could leave her, she had to commit to holiness — to put her trust in him in a most audacious way. She had to find it within herself to lift her weakened hand to grasp his — and as soon as she did, she was rewarded. Her bodily health restored, she gave thanks, and attended to his needs.

God’s hand is always outstretched to us. Will we take it, even if the fever of sin and pride and worldly concerns rages in our souls? Will we muster the strength? Will we be audacious enough to have confidence in His Fatherly goodness?
