Deacon Dan Simmet—Celebrating 25 Years of Ordained Life



I'm on my way to Mundelein Seminary in the Fall of 1993 to begin the process of Formation within the Sacred Order of Deacons, and I'm feeling totally unworthy. I thought to myself "how did I get here"! So for the next 30 minutes of driving, I would try to remember all of the spiritual moments of my life, starting from early Childhood to becoming an Adult. Here are my memories:

The first memory was with my Babcia (Polish Grandma). She lived on the 2nd floor of our two story home. As a preschooler I would walk up the interior stairway to see her, and we would watch television together. We would cuddle on the couch and Babcia would begin to watch Bishop Fulton Sheen. I was fascinated by his scribbling on the chalk board with so much enthusiasm, that I couldn't wait to attend Holy Rosary, our Catholic school. That happened the following year.

Our school teachers were all Felician (Polish Franciscan) Nuns. Their unique Order took a vow of poverty, and they would own nothing during their lifetime. The education they provided was excellent in the required subjects, but they were teaching us so much more. Their view of Humanity was all about the care of others. Directed by the Nuns, we would have paper drives, Lenten and Advent Bazaars, turkey raffles and more to garner money for the poor. Our neighbors and friends would bake pies, collect clothing and deprive themselves of luxury so they could send material things to Poland, in hopes that it would ease their suffering. I was an altar boy by the 5th grade, and served at daily mass during Pre-Vatican days. It felt so special to be on the Altar, and the Nuns regularly reminded us of that privilege.

Everything about our family was centered on our Parish. We lived only two blocks away, so we could hear the church bells beckoning us to mass. As a family we would walk together, and there we would meet our Aunts, Uncles and Cousins and then sit in the pews with our classmates. After Mass there would be time to catch up with family and friends, and the remainder of the day would be spent at rest.

There were fond memories of my parents. My mother would have Holy Water at the front door, and don't even think about going outside without first blessing yourself. There would be times of kneeling together and praying the Rosary even though we giggled a little. And then there was making a cake for baby Jesus at Christmas, followed by singing Happy Birthday before eating our Christmas meal. My Father taught me a thing or two about caring for others. When the movie *The Ten Commandments* came out, the entire Diocese Schools were bussed to the nearest theater. When I asked my father for a dime to get popcorn, he said yes, under one condition. He said, "When you get to the movie theater, go across the road and see a street vendor who is crippled, and buy your popcorn from him. If you agree, you can have a dime". Each year, when the *Ten Commandments* movie is advertised on television, I once again remember that caring memory and teaching moment.

Now I'm remembering life after graduation from grade school and attending public high school. I went from 50 kids in my class to 1100 freshman. I was nervous and afraid, and I then remembered the line from the *Wizard of Oz*, "you're not in Kansas anymore". Life quickly moves from High School to College, College to the Army, and from the Army to Marriage. Then life really got busy! We would have three children, a 24 hour Firefighter/Paramedic career, a second job to save for college and all of the trappings that come with those decisions. My life was out of balance and I knew it.

Even with our lives getting busy, we managed to educate our children in Catholic School, volunteering on Church Committees and Boards, but my heart wasn't in it. My prayer life was being compromised and my focus at church was even worse. I needed a shot-in-the-arm, but where was that going to come from?

On a given day, grumpy about how busy life had become, I was volunteering outside church with a bunch of people. There would be cleaning, painting and general repairs to the grounds. I was painting in the rear of the Rectory when I heard a voice. It said, "Have you ever thought of becoming a Deacon?" I turned around and said -----"Whaaaaaat", I'm not a Holy Person, -----am I?"

As Paul Harvey used to say, "Now for the rest of the story." Please join me next weekend where I'll be preaching at all Masses and celebrating the privilege of Diaconal Ministry and how I was eventually able to get there.



After three years of ministry to both St. Francis High School and St. Michael Parish, it is time to say goodbye to Fr. John Honiotes, who has been appointed as pastor of St. Mary in Minooka, effective July 1.

Please join me in thanking Fr. John for his service to both ministries, which I know were challenging at times, but which he nonetheless embraced whole-heartedly. Please pray for him as he begins this new chapter of priestly service.

Plans are underway for a farewell reception after all the Masses on one of the weekends in June, to be determined soon.

Thank you, Fr. John for your service. We pray that God will bless your new ministry as pastor!






