

Fr. Dan Hoehn - FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



You may be aware that the U.S. bishops have called for a Eucharistic Revival – a three phase initiative to bring awareness to the great gift that our Lord has given to his Church.

After the initial planning phase at the diocesan level, we have now entered into the second phase. The goal, according to the website <u>eucharisticrevival.org</u>, is to "... foster Eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through faithful celebration of the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, missions, resources, preaching, and organic movements of the Holy Spirit."

As part of our response to that goal, I have asked former editor-in-chief of the journal *Christianity Today,* Mark Galli, to offer some insights from his unique perspective of being a newly initiated Catholic. Here is a first installment!

Bored with Mass

Most Catholics are bored with Mass. This is not a revelation, of course, but it is an understandably sad reality. You can see it week in and week out at Mass here and there—slumping in the pew; impatient tapping of the feet; and not a few distracted, tired gazes that say, "I can hardly wait until this is over," confirmed by the broad smile that explodes on faces when it is over. Sometimes, the deacon ends the Mass with, "The Mass has ended," and the congregation replies, "Thanks be to God!" Some are grateful because they have relished the mystery they have just participated in. But I suspect some are just grateful that the whole business is over.

The most bored, of course, don't even bother to attend anymore. It's a common feature of nearly every parish in the country that only a minority of Catholics in the parish attend Mass even once a month.

This is not only sad but ironic, considering that what's happening at Mass is nothing less than a miracle—the bread and wine becoming the body and blood of our Lord, that Jesus tangibly comes to us in an extraordinary moment.

In another way, it makes perfect sense. A poll of a couple of years ago revealed that 70 percent of Catholics think the Eucharist is merely symbolic. The bread and wine, they believe, merely presents a picture of Christ's death, and when we all partake, it's merely a symbol of our unity with Christ and with one another. Nothing really happens at that moment, nothing of any consequence anyway. And if that's the case, why bother even to show up simply to be reminded of an object lesson?

Of course, a lot of the bored are also angry and disillusioned. They rightly point to the hypocrisy of some clergy (abuse crisis!) or rail against what they perceive as the Church's moral "inflexibility" with its stances on contraception, abortion, and sexual ethics. Frustration can lead one to doubt the Church's teachings about the Eucharist: "Real presence? Ha! If we were partaking of Christ himself, wouldn't the Church look more like Christ?"

Then again, to criticize the Church is like shooting fish in a barrel. And indifference to the miracle of the Mass--well, this is not only the temptation of the bored and angry, but also the faithful. When I think of my own Mass behavior, I admit that I contribute to the problem. I recall more than once finding myself in the middle of the service and realizing I must have rattled off the Sanctus or the Lord's Prayer, but I did not

remember doing so! My mind apparently was far, far away in a distant galaxy, probably worrying or planning an afternoon golf outing. Thank God that the Mass doesn't depend on my pious state of mind, that the liturgy and the receiving of the body and blood can work in me even when I'm unaware of their power.

Occasionally, however, the Spirit breaks through our distracted minds and hearts. I remember one Mass when a young priest choked up as he was saying the words of our Lord, "This is my body" He had to take a few moments to collect himself before he could continue. It was a moving moment for all of us as we realized afresh the miracle that was causing this young man to stand amazed.

How to move forward when our hearts our dulled? How do we begin or deepen the sense that a miracle takes place at every Mass, and a life changing miracle at that?

Of course, we cannot do it. The Mass is an act of faith, and faith is not something we can conjure up by will power. Faith is a divine gift. Yes, we can prepare the field so that God can plant seeds that will sprout into faith. And yet even the desire to plow such a field is prompted by the Holy Spirit.

I suspect that many alienated Catholics are not happy with their current situation. Deep down they long to have their faith rekindled, to again give themselves to something greater than themselves, to enjoy that sense of gracious transcendence they once enjoyed.

Here is the good news for all of us: If you have the desire to know, love, and experience God, then you've already been given a gift of mustard-size-seed faith. And if you say, "I don't really care about loving God," and yet deep down you wish you did care—that too is a sign that God is already working in your heart, working in your depths so that, in your better moments, you know you need God even when you feel indifferent to him. That is a small enough step to begin the thousand-mile journey of faith.

For all of us, the first small step of faith renewal starts with the prayer of the man in the Gospel, who when Jesus asked him if he had enough faith so that his son might be healed, said, "Lord, I do believe. Help my unbelief."



Attention Eucharistic Ministers


