

The RCIA has a new name!

The *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*, or "RCIA", as it was formerly known, is now called OCIA – the "*Order* of Christian Initiation of Adults" – more closely corresponding to the original Latin designation. The word "rite" – from which is derived the word "ritual" – refers to the numerous rituals during the process of becoming fully initiated into the Catholic Church. For instance, along this journey one participates in the Rite of Acceptance or Entrance to the Catechumenate; the Rite of

Sending; the Rite of Election; the various Rites of Scrutiny; and of course, finally, the Rites of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion.

So translating the Latin "ordo" back to "order" rather than "rite" makes it clearer that becoming Catholic is not a matter of participating in a single ritual, (which the singular term "rite" may imply), but rather is an *orderly* process consisting of various steps along the path of conversion.

At any rate, it's time once again to ask for your help in surfacing some names of potential candidates for our OCIA program.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is designed for adults who, after hearing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, eventually come to a conscious and free decision to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. It is through Baptism that one becomes an adopted child of God, a temple of the Holy Spirit, and a recipient of the promise of eternal life. Confirmation completes the Baptism, strengthening one with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. In the Eucharist, one is nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ.

The OCIA program is intended for:

- 1. Those who have never been baptized.
- 2. Those baptized into a non-Catholic community, and hence in need of Confirmation and Holy Communion.
- 3. A Catholic who was only baptized, but lacking Confirmation and/or First Communion.

The process can be likened to a spiritual journey, which takes place within a community of other seekers, whereby one encounters Christ and becomes more closely conformed to his likeness.

Weekly 90-minute meetings begin in September and culminate with the full initiation of the unbaptized (the first category above) at the Easter Vigil, and the subsequent completion of initiation for the other two categories during the Easter season. There is no initial commitment.


