

in such a way that the answer was inescapable.

What I find interesting is the fact that – unbeknownst to the chief priests and elders – Jesus was referring to them. They are the wretched men who deserve a wretched death.

The landowner in the parable is God. The vineyard that he planted represents the people of Israel whom the Father tended with special care – by leading them out of slavery, by feeding them in the desert, by defeating all their foes and giving them the Promised Land. This special care is represented in the parable by the hedge around the vineyard and by the lookout tower, which were meant to protect the vines from predators.

The servants who were sent to obtain the produce represent the prophets — whom God raised up at various times to remind the Chosen People to turn back to God; to remind them of the need to bear fruit. The greedy tenants who killed for the sake of the inheritance represent the chief priests and elders who time and time again put the prophets to death - as Jesus recalls in his lament over Jerusalem: "Jerusalem. Jerusalem, you who kill the prophets and stone those sent to vou..."

The chief priests and elders see the truth clearly when the problem is evaluated from a standpoint of disinterestedness rather than from self-interest; when there is nothing at stake; when seeing the truth doesn't involve any need for change on their part.

How difficult it can be to see ourselves clearly when there is something at stake; when acknowledging the truth might necessitate some sort of change.

Every one of the items mentioned regarding the vineyard in the parable was an improvement that was meant to enhance production. Notice that the vineyard was planted. The owner didn't simply find a patch of wild grapes and put a fence around it. Notice that in the first reading, according to the prophet Isaiah, the owner planted the choicest vines. The hedge was a

The men to a wretched death." Jesus phrased the question parable was clearly aimed at the religious leaders of Israel. But it has some real meaning for your life and mine. We are very much like those tenant farmers. We have been entrusted with a part of God's vineyard. We have been afforded ample opportunity to lead useful and productive lives. Each of us has been given some advantages. We did not create them, nor did we cause them. They may have been gifts from parents, or from our culture. Those who possess those gifts deserve no credit. Those who do not have them are not to be blamed. Our only responsibility is to accept them and use them in the right way. It seems to me that there are two attitudes to have regarding life's advantages. First we can look on them as our own, to be used or misused as we desire. The tenant farmers in the story did that. When the owner sent servants to collect, they would not pay. When he sent his son they plotted to kill him and take the vineyard for themselves.

> The second attitude we could take toward our advantages is to look up on them as an endowment, belonging to God, entrusted to us for the benefit of others. That's what the owner wanted for his tenants. He entrusted them with his vineyard. He wanted them to use it, not steal it. He wanted them to provide well for their families, but also he wanted them to pay the rent. God expects the same from us. He has entrusted us with advantages. They are in our hands now. We can use them as we will, but they belong to him. We can use them, but we must pay rent. The way we do that is to use these advantages not only for ourselves, but for the benefit of others also.

> Fritz Kreisler was one of the most renowned violinists in his day. He died in 1962. In his later years, he said to a small group of friends, "I was born with music in my soul. I did not acquire it. It was a gift from God. Therefore I never thought of the money earned from it as really mine. I never even bought a home with it. This gift has been the primary difference between me and the homeless. That is the crux of the matter: Ownership, or stewardship? Self-seeking, or selfgiving? Sooner or later you must make up your mind: by which philosophy do you intend to live?
