THOUGHTS ON TURNING 80 By Fr. Tony Taschetta



I am penning this on February 2, 2024... Groundhog Day. I hope when I wake up tomorrow it will be February 3. (I'm sure Bill Murray would approve). Today is also

the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord when Joseph and Mary brought baby Jesus to the temple. While there, two of my biblical favorites, Simeon and Anna did their incredible thing... They got ready for the next step. In a very short time now, I too, will be getting ready for my next step. I will be turning 80 and, please God, I will be ready for wherever God wants me to go and whatever He wants me to be.

In a nostalgic mood I earlier today listened to Frank Sinatra sing, "IT WAS A VERY GOOD YEAR." I am sure the Lord will allow me a little reminiscence as I look over the years past and where I (and by extension all of us) will be as we travel along the paths that God has laid out for us.

When I was 25, it really was a very good year. I was in graduate school at Indiana University in Religious Studies and on my birthday, March 3 (a day I share with Alexander Graham Bell) I walked around with a sign on my neck that read, "serving the public for a quarter of a century!" Ah, youthful arrogance! (It was the late 60s you know.)

On my 39th birthday I rejoiced in running the 8 1/2 miles from Christ The King parish in Lombard to my home in Wheaton. On my 40th birthday I was at Saint Anne in Oswego and woke up crying on my pillow. I had just become middle aged! I didn't want to get out of bed but forced myself down to the 8 AM Mass where I was greeted with a cake and 41 lit candles. (I cried again.)

I turned 50 during my years at St. Teresa in Kankakee. It was there that I got the best compliment of my life from a young altar girl who whispered to her trainee, "he's really old... but he's cool!"

Since I was more than halfway through, we threw a party and I invited 500 of my closest friends and, of course, the theme was the fabulous 50s... Poodle skirts, DA's and all. That year I wrote an article, "Thoughts on Turning 50."

What I remember most was that I was reminding myself that I was not going to write the great American novel or climb Mount Everest and somehow that was just fine.

Tennis players and swimmers reach their prime at a very young age. I don't believe priests reach their prime until their 50s. By the time you're 50 you have some idea of what you're supposed to be doing and still have the energy to do it. My 12 years at St. Teresa were among my most fruitful. It was there that I adopted my son, Luis, and buried my granddaughter, Ange Michelle, the daughter of my daughter Tu Anh. It was there that I began to mature into my priesthood.

After my tenure at St. Teresa, I went kicking and screaming to St Isidore in Bloomingdale which proved to be my most challenging assignment of all. It was not that the people were not good, they were great! It was just that it was a parish of 6000 families, 22,000 individuals and a staff of 72. I had no idea of how to pastor a parish that large. I still don't. But, obviously God does. Thank you Jesus!

At the age of 60 I checked off one of the things on my bucket list... the full Chicago Triathlon. To my surprise I completed it. We also used it as a fundraiser... on the shirt we gave to the donors was printed, "I told my pastor to jump in the lake... And I paid for it!"

In my late 60s God gave me a dream parish... Mary Queen of Heaven in Elmhurst. It was as good as it gets for an aging priest as he prepares for the next leg of his journey. At the age of 70 it was time to retire from, not active ministry, but from administration. Being a priest and doing ministry for me is like breathing. You have to do it to live. Running a parish is a whole other thing. (Those of you who know me, know how good I am at meetings.)

In 2014 I left the parish and headed for a Big Sur California to live with the Camaldolese Hermits. It was time to discern my next step. I loved living with the hermits but "Hermit" is not my middle name. I am a parish priest through and through. We are the worker bees of the clerical set. After three months I found myself back home doing parish ministry which I am doing to this day. (Praise God.)

Now I am turning 80. If 70 is the youth of old age, what is 80? It's just plain old age. I am an old man and don't mind it at all. I have no desire to be 16 again (God forbid.) So what's next? What are the thoughts of turning 80? The first is that life is short. The Psalmist tells us that 70 is the sum of our years or 80 if we are strong. Well, relatively speaking so far I'm pretty strong... now what?

Since the time of writing the great American novel is over, what am I called to do? A number of years ago I realized that my life is not just about what has happened or what I have done but what is still yet to come. We pray for the coming of the Kingdom and my job is to help usher it in. More and more I find myself living for the next generation which follows me. I live for the children and the children's children. One of my greatest joys is to celebrate Mass with the school children of St. Michael in Wheaton. In any way I can pass on to them what it means to be a child of God and to know that we are being held by a Love beyond words. That you cannot be separated ever from God... Well... That's enough.

I have no idea how many years I have left. I do say my three Hail Mary's every day for the grace of a happy death. But when or how it will be is way beyond my pay grade. That's not my call, it belongs to the Master.

And at 80 my life is still a rather open book with the final chapters yet to be written. Wherever He leads me, please God, I will go. It has so far been an incredible journey and where we go from here is not really up to me. Lord, just give me the grace to embrace it.

For those of you who wish, Fr. Agustin Ortega, pastor of Divine Savior Parish in Downers Grove (67th and Main Street) will be holding an 80th birthday celebration for me. It will be on Saturday, March 2 with a Mass at 4 PM and a reception to follow immediately afterwards in the parish hall. All are cordially invited to attend.

Thank you all for making me the priest who I am today. You have taught me well. And God has been very, very good to me.



PEACE IN THE HOLY LAND





WHAT DO WE DO WHEN WE DO NOT KNOW WHAT TO DO?

Throughout the journey of our lives, we all experience moments of uncertainty, ambiguity, or indecision. We can feel small, inadequate, and almost paralyzed as we face looming problems ranging

from our own personal issues to worldwide crises.

Grounded in faith, Saint Francis of Assisi wisely taught that when we do not know what to do, we should "pray, obey, and love." Our Catholic tradition reflects his wise counsel.

PRAY In the good times and bad, we turn to God in prayer. Through prayer, we realize that we are not the center of the universe, as we raise our hearts and minds to God. As Jesus taught, "For human beings this is impossible, but for God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26).

OBEY While prayer is the proper first step, it should not end there. We also need to be obedient to God, always discerning: What is the best response according to God's command, law, and divine will?

LOVE However we respond to problems, our actions should always reflect Christ's love, specifically following the greatest commandment: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind... and you shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22: 37–39).

Since October 2023, the conflicts in the Holy Land have escalated into a horrible war. Most of us follow the news with broken hearts and feel helpless.

Recently, I attended a dinner in Chicagoland (photo above) at which His Beatitude Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, spoke about the realities in the Holy Land.

Born in Italy in 1965, Cardinal Pizzaballa entered the Franciscan Order. He serves as the Latin Patriarch and Archbishop of Jerusalem. On January 27, 2024, we gathered at a dinner hosted by the Arab American Catholic Community (AACC), which exists to unite and support Catholic Arabs within the United States. In attendance were also many Knights and Dames from the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre. Its mission includes supporting and promoting the Holy Land and protecting the Christian presence there. I am humbled to

belong to this ancient and noble order and am proud to witness the local members' dedication and commitment to this mission.

Known for his constant efforts to promote solidarity, cultural and historical preservation, interreligious dialogue, and embrace and advocate for peace, justice, and reconciliation, Cardinal Pizzaballa's 45-minute presentation literally quieted the entire banquet room, as even the waitstaff stopped to listen to his every word. He called for a ceasefire and spoke of the Catholic Church's boundless efforts to provide food, shelter, housing, healthcare, and spiritual care for those affected by the war.

He also prophetically commented that instead of striving for peace in the current war, both sides unfortunately are fighting only for victory — a victory that clearly delineates a winner and a loser. "Peace is not victory," said Cardinal Pizzaballa. "It is the willingness on both sides to give something up for the greater good."

He spent a lot of time laying the foundation for the need for true peace, a peace which is reflected only in Jesus. He reminded us that peace is not the absence of conflict. Instead, it includes the presence of justice, reconciliation, discernment of God's will, and the desire for the common good.

This Lent, as we prepare ourselves to enter this season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, you might consider donating to a reputable organization or charity that aids and services to those in need in the Holy Land; some suggestions are included at the bottom of this article. Also, on Good Friday, throughout the Diocese of Joliet, a collection will be taken up to support the work of the Franciscans working in the Holy Land.

The Holy Land holds a powerful place in our hearts and in salvation history. It is where Jesus was born, grew up, taught, prayed, performed miracles, suffered, died, and was resurrected. In solidarity, let us join Cardinal Pizzaballa's call for an end to the violence and for a just and lasting peace in the Holy Land as we turn to God with prayer, obedience, and love.

Jesus, Prince of Peace, pray for us.

But how easy is it to say "Here I am, Lord," when a neighbor needs our help, or when we are invited to join a parish ministry, or when we are asked to provide financial support? Often times we are called when it's not convenient for us. Discipleship is not easy, most of the time it will make us uncomfortable and vulnerable.


