

ASK FATHER SUNNY:

Settling in, Plans, Needs and Challenges

In certain occasions and seasons throughout the year, my bulletin article will come in a Question-and-Answer Format to respond to some questions that I get asked by parishioners. I believe that when a question is asked by a few people, it is probably something that others are also asking but have not had a chance to do so. It is a good way to respond to people's questions collectively and consistently, so I don't have to repeat myself over and over. So here we go, my dear St. Michael family, with my first "ASK FR. SUNNY" article:

QUESTION #1: ARE YOU FINALLY SETTLED BACK TO ST. MICHAEL'S?

ANSWER: I feel settled, now after 6 weeks. I have felt settled for some time now, especially since all the important boxes that needed to be opened are now in order. The rest of the fixing, ordering and classifying of stuff will be ongoing tasks for the next few more months, but I am well settled, and finding my rhythm.

QUESTION #2: WHAT ARE YOUR PLANS? WHAT WOULD YOU LIKE TO ACCOMPLISH DURING YOUR TIME AS OUR PASTOR?

ANSWER: I have asked God why He sent me to Saint Michael's again, even without putting my name in the "interested" list for the Placement Board. That is because my plan is to do what God's plan is. This requires me to go into a serious discernment of spirit. But if God simply wants to use my passion and gifts for His purposes, then let me share you three that are in the forefront. First, I am passionate about <u>evangelization</u>, about sharing my faith with others and accompanying people to fall in love with God as we get to know Him more deeply. Second, I find myself being most passionate about <u>building community and creating connections and bonds among people</u>. And third, I am passionate about <u>different forms of mission work</u>, that is, helping people, reaching beyond our parish borders and comfort zones to find Jesus in the poor and the oppressed.

QUESTION #3: WHAT DO YOU NEED? HOW CAN WE HELP YOU?

ANSWER: Many parishioners have asked me this question even before I arrived here, and I am very grateful and moved by such display of generosity. I found myself not knowing how to answer the question for me, but certainly, I have an answer for our parish. I need leaders, people who are willing to do something more for our community. In fact, I hope that every Saint Michael parishioner can look at their Catholicism from the point of view of leadership. We are a very big parish, and for me to be able to serve most effectively as you priest, I will need collaborators to share and give birth to a larger vision that will be able to impact more people within and beyond our community. I hope to bring this to fruition as I continue to transition here at our parish.

QUESTION #4: WHAT CHALLENGES ARE YOU FACING AS YOU HAVE BECOME OUR PASTOR?

ANSWER: I have a few challenges that have surfaced in my transition as the pastor of Saint Michael. First is my availability. I always love to say yes when people ask for my time and to be present where they are, but it is just impossible here at Saint Michael. We are a very hyperactive and busy parish. On top of that, I am still in the Bishop's Board of Consultors and am working as the Director of Ongoing Formation for Priests, adding to a few more responsibilities with some diocesan organizations. There are also some situations where there are conflicts in my calendar, so I have to find a way to resolve them or to compromise on timing. Because I did not really anticipate to move to a new parish this year, there are certain commitments in my calendar that will mean that I will miss some other things that are going on here in the parish. I hope that these conflicts will get better as I move forward into the next fiscal year. Second, it comes to pass that I have to deal with some health conditions that will require me to take a bit of time to address and normalize within this fiscal year. I received a much needed pep talk from a dear doctor who told me that I need to take care of my physical health in order that I can serve best as your pastor. So, yes, I have some challenges, but I am joyful, hopeful and enthusiastic. I am also confident that the Lord will find a way for me, and as I do my share in the bargain, I will resolve these, with your prayers along the way.

I hope you find these responses useful for your understanding. It is a blessing to be here at Saint Michael, and I appreciate the reassurances that many of you have provided. God bless the Church!
