

A SURGE OF JOYFUL ENERGY

The month of August is the annual witness of an extraordinary surge of joyful energy in our church campus as the kids return to school for the new school year. I remember it all like it was yesterday, standing there in front of the school greeting kids and their family. This daily drop off point is where the kids rush in with excitement to meet their classmates again and see their teachers in the classrooms. We also expect then that there will be some tears shed by some little kids who are getting to school for the first time, or even parents who get nostalgic about the fact that their children are now beginning a new phase in their life.

Last Tuesday, I was so glad to go back to the front of Saint Michael School. A little banner in the corner said, "Welcome Lancers!" and the queue of cars was long earlier than normal. Principal Ferguson had some dance music blasting in the middle of the lot, as the students walked through the doors. From their cars, the parents had big smiles on their faces, waving back to the greeting team. Something about having the children back to school always injects a dose of liveliness and enthusiasm. Soon after, I went to visit the kids' classrooms to pray for them and bless them with holy water, asking God for His Divine Guidance for them to grow in wisdom, knowledge, character, and love through the teachers and staff who will journey with them to a fruitful school year.

On Wednesday morning, we celebrated the first school mass of the school year. Masses with the children are always light-hearted, and I always look forward to talk to them about Jesus and His Church. These school masses are opportunities to provide a solid foundation of faith, which is best laid during this time of their lives. These years of formation and growing are also the best opportunities to build a solid life of virtue and prayer.

My dear parishioners, as we bask on this joyful energy that surrounds our church these days, let me share some of my personal convictions about the need for us to teach our children about the faith and Christian virtues as early as now:

- 1. Start early in introducing God to your children. These early years of learning will shape the deeper levels of your child's consciousness.
- 2. The children have the innate capacity for learning. It is a disservice to their gifts if we dumb down our lessons because we presume that they don't understand.
- 3. The character of a child is built through the help of consistent witness and support from parents, priests, teachers, deacons and the larger community. I promise, the children are watching, and they are keen to detect inconsistencies in our witness for them, even if they may not tell us.
- 4. To effectively nurture a child's faith and relationship with Jesus, we have to bring them to Sunday Mass, and pray with the rest of the community. Being with the bigger community allows them to recognize the bigger picture through which their lives are appreciated.
- 5. Lastly, the children are our gifts and our responsibilities. It is part of our mission as a church to bring the children to Jesus, because they belong to God. By our holy vocation, we are entrusted these children as stewards of Divine Purpose that is already in God's mind for all of them. Our responsibility is to help them fall in love with God.

Let us use the energy that the children's presence gives to us. It is my prayer that St. Michael will continue to be known as the exemplary parish in nurturing the gift of children in the school and in our faith formation program. God bless our children, God bless our teaching ministries, God bless our parish!




