

Fr. Santos 'Sunny' Castillo — FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

TO BE A SAINT IS OUR ONLY OPTION

The month of November has begun and as always, it started with one of my favorite liturgical events of the year – the feast of all saints. Not only is it my name day, given my official first name is "Santos" which is the Hispanic word for "saints" but even more importantly, it is the day when we celebrate together the communion of saints in heaven, which is the community every Christian should aspire to be part of. My seminary teacher used to say, "When the saints go marching in, you want to be marching too."

But when I talk about these things, I seem to get a common repulsion or abrogating reaction from Catholics. People seem to cringe about the idea that they are expected to become saints. My typical response to that is this: It is the only choice, really, if you want to be with God, and the other option is definitely something you wouldn't like to choose.

To be with God means to be a saint, and to not be a saint means to be completely alienated or removed from everything that is of God. The saints are in heaven, and those who are not in heaven are either suffering purification to eventually be in heaven, or have elected by their way-of-life to be in hell, that is the final and absolute spiritual separation from God. That is why we all should be aspiring to be a saint!

FIRST OBJECTION: "But, Fr. Sunny, to be a saint is too lofty of a goal. I will never be able to live up to that expectation or demand."

RESPONSE: In Matthew 5:48, Jesus tells us, "Be perfect just as your Heavenly Father is perfect." Jesus elevates the ideal for all to follow and He invites us all to strive for the holiness of God Himself. So we have to do our part and let God work in us. And for those who are overwhelmed by such an expectation, we hear Jesus respond in a reassuring way in Matthew 19:26, "For human beings, this is impossible, but for God all things are possible." To become a saint indeed requires that we are engaged with the constant grace of God, because only in God can we become holy.

SECOND OBJECTION: "The thought of being a saint is so overwhelming!"

RESPONSE: What is overwhelming about being good and making the right choice <u>right here and right now</u>? The present moment is all you have to deal with when it comes to being a saint. There is no need to look at the big picture and worry about the past or the future. The invitation of sainthood is to be your best self in that specific moment, to strive for excellence by the grace of God.

THIRD OBJECTION: "But I am a sinner!"

RESPONSE: And so were all the saints that the Church has canonized over the centuries. When we look at the story of the saints, we realize that they are exactly like all of us – they were tempted, they have sinned, but they sought mercy and forgiveness, and they grew in synergy with the grace of God. To be a saint doesn't mean that you have not sinned. It simply means that in the midst of sin and temptation in our earthly journey, we continue to seek God's mercy and healing, humbling ourselves before Him and trying our very best to be better every single moment of every day.

FOURTH OBJECTION: "I am a lost cause..."

RESPONSE: That is what the devil wants us to believe. Don't listen to that voice that will stop you from striving. The truth is, God's sanctifying grace is always present. And Jesus called all of us His Church and left us with His Word, His Sacraments and His Holy Spirit so that we will never ever be a lost cause in the spiritual life.

As we have started this special month celebrating who we are and what we strive for as saints, let us ask God to make us holy. Together here at Saint Michael, God is making us holy.





WORKING ON THE MARGINS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our diocese will soon take up the national collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). Your support for this collection brings change to communities across the country and empowers those living in poverty to transform their communities into reflections of the Kingdom of God. One of the principles that has made CCHD successful at reaching people on the margins for more than 50 years is its support for community-based solutions rather than uniform, top-down programs that do not account for local needs or include local voices.

The Northwest Hub, in Oregon's capital city of Salem, is one group that community members created to address the unique needs of local citizens. Oregon's returning citizens face difficulty finding work. A "returning citizen" is someone newly released from incarceration in state correctional facilities or from treatment in the state psychiatric hospital, transitional living, and treatment facilities—all of which are concentrated in Salem. Their employment opportunities are further limited because the city's public transit system does not operate on nights or weekends. The Northwest Hub began in 2013 in a church basement with a vision of making bicycle transportation accessible to anyone and of providing training in skills that empower community members. By providing community members with free access to bicycles, locks, and parts, as well as vocational training in bicycle mechanics, the Northwest Hub equips them with job skills and affordable means of transportation so they can pursue new opportunities.

Your support for CCHD helps local community groups like the Northwest Hub reach and empower people in ways best suited to the communities they serve. All CCHD national grants are approved by the bishop in the diocese where the funded groups operate. When you give to CCHD, 25% of your contribution stays in our diocese to help your own community continue CCHD's successful work of reaching those on the margins.

Priests do not come from a big warehouse

DIRECTOR OF VOCATIONS DIOCESE OF JOLIET

When I was a little boy, I would often wonder where priests come from.

It's funny now, but I really thought there was a giant warehouse or training facility where they were waiting for a call from the coach to put them in the game. Almost like with baseball, when it was their time, they would get called up from the minor leagues and if they did well, they stayed and if they didn't, they'd be sent back.

Now I know that isn't the case, but to a second grader it made all the sense in the world. The truth is, priests come from families. They come from homes like yours and mine and they live ordinary lives like everyone around us. They go to school, play sports, have hobbies, some dated, some didn't, they participate in Church, and they have friends and siblings who help form their character and a real sense of who they are as a person and what they stand for. It is from within this community that they

begin to know and have a relationship with God.

One of the greatest obstacles to young men knowing that the priesthood is something they might be called to



is apparent lack of support from within the family for a priestly vocation. We were often asked if we wanted to be a doctor, a lawyer, a teacher, an engineer or something else when we grow up, but rarely were we asked if we ever thought about the priesthood. Now, I know it is objectively different because it is a vocation and not a career, but what if we gave it the same attention? I truly believe more men would be open to exploring the thought that 'maybe I'm supposed to be a priest.'

So, what are three things a parent can do to create space for a priestly vocation in the family?

1. Make Sunday and any sacramen-

tal occasion (Confession) special.

- 2. Take time to talk about how God has impacted your own life and show your children how you pray.
- 3. Live well the life of virtue and continue working on your own marriage.

Whether it is simply the prayers before meals, Weekly Sunday Mass, or an occasionally rosary or sacrament of confession, these men encountered God and began to walk with Him. They may not have always prayed or been the best people, but God is faithful and walked with them through their ups and downs just like our families do with us.

From within the family, a vocation is cultivated, and it is only with the support of parents, grandparents, siblings and friends that a young man can be open to a priestly vocation.

At some point, these men began to recognize within themselves that they were made for more — for a deeper relationship that called them to make a gift of themselves, to pour themselves out for the sake of others.


