

GROWING IN PRAYER

As we begin the new Season of Ordinary Time, I am calling upon you, my dear Saint Michael Family, to continue my ongoing invitation to harness our spiritual gifts. And no, I am not asking you to suddenly develop extraordinary healing powers or prophetic gifts. I am asking you all to simply continue making concrete steps to growing in your prayer. That is, in itself, power and grace that we all need to sustain us as a parish, so we can grow together in holiness and bear the fruits God desires.

PRAYER IS VERY IMPORTANT. It holds profound significance in our lives, offering a powerful means of connection with God, fostering spiritual maturity and cultivating inner peace. It is important in having a genuine relationship with God. It is an important piece in keeping a healthy spiritual relationship. I know many people who have stopped practicing their faith because they never had a real spiritual relationship with God, in the first place. In other words, they never really learned how to pray, which means, they never really prayed after all.

PRAYER IS NOT JUST RITUAL OR MEMORIZED WORDS. It is more than just a ritual or tradition. Sometimes, we Catholics think that if we know how to "recite" the Our Father and the "Hail Mary" that we are already praying. It is possible to recite these words meaninglessly, and without any consideration of the relationship that is expressed behind them. Prayer must always be founded on a "spiritual relationship" with God and God's family while at the same time enhancing and fructifying it.

PRAYER BREEDS JOY, INSPIRATION AND DIRECTION. When I need to reconnect to a space of inner joy, I pray. During critical moments of decision-making, I take it to prayer. Most if not all of my life's major decisions, including the discernment to embrace the priesthood are fruits of prayer. If done properly and genuinely, prayer can indeed be very advantageous. An intimate conversation with God allows us to express gratitude and develop a grateful heart, which is a necessary ingredient to personal fulfillment and joy. Prayer allows us seek guidance from God, because Jesus promised that His Holy Spirit will guide us. Prayer guides us to discern well the divine plan of God and find solace in the knowing that God is there in the midst of our choices and decisions. It can happen that during a quiet meditation, our minds become clear and inspired to make the right decisions and clarify the divine will.

PRAYER OFFERS MENTAL AND EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING. Beyond the spiritual benefits, prayer can have a transformative impact on our mental and emotional well-being. It offers moments of reflection, helping to clear the mind and provide perspective amidst life's chaos. In prayer, we can also find strength to face challenges, knowing that we are not alone. Prayer has a calming effect, and has a way of helping us manage the stresses of daily living. I personally find this to be true. I find so much solace in prayer that on a stressful and busy day, prayer allows me to pace myself well and manage the tensions caused by the demands of my priestly ministry. I can imagine that this is true to every walk of life.

Two weeks ago, I told the children at school mass that a relationship cannot be sustained if we do not connect with the other person in conversation and spiritual presence. That is why it is not possible to be intimate with God if we do not pray. As a church community, this is the heart of everything that we do. We pray, and everything we do is done in a prayerful stance.

As your pastor, I will be amiss in my responsibility if I do not remind you of this special and important aspect of our life, so here I am doing it again here. Let us never stop making Saint Michael Church a place of prayer, so that everything else that we do may be grounded, directed and fulfilled through the spirit that prayer provides. Amen.


