

PALM SUNDAY, THE DOOR OF GRACE

"It seems to me that there are a lot of people coming to Palm Sunday, about as many as Easter Sunday..." observes one member of the Liturgy and Worship Commission. Another one responds, "That's because people are getting something..." referring to the actual palms that are given away on a Sunday like today. To some people, this might be their only realistic time to be able to hear the passion narrative, because by true life situations, they are unable to attend the Good Friday Service of the Cross. These are sensible thoughts, my dear church. But the very essence of Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday is in the calling forth of people of faith to enter into the holiest of weeks in the catholic liturgical calendar. Yes, Palm Sunday is the doorway to Holy Week, which is the week of absolute grace and blessing.

WELCOME THE LORD WELL. The palms are the symbols of welcome that the Israelites used when Jesus entered triumphantly into the City of David. He entered as a King, and people brought their palm branches and laid cloths and linens on the path when He passed on a donkey to show their reverence to Him. It was truly a welcome worthy of royalty. As you receive the palms this weekend, receive Jesus into your lives and into your homes as your King, Savior, Lord and Savior. We know better today what really happened after He was welcomed into the city; the people would eventually turn their backs on Him, because He did not meet their expectations. They thought that He would rule as the new David that would set them free from the Goliath of their time – the Roman Oppressors. But alas, the Divine agenda was such that He would set them and the world free from something more important, something they did not see. And so, my dear church, receive the palms this week, with a real resolve to keep Jesus where He belongs, at the center of our lives.

PARTICIPATE IN THE LITURGIES. The best way to observe the solemnity of Holy Week is through your participation in our sacred liturgies. We all remember these divinely revealed teachings about eternal life through the signs and symbolisms of the prayers of the Church. The Diocese will celebrate Chrism Mass tomorrow, to bless the oils that are used for the sacramental life of all parishes in the entire Church of Joliet. We will enter the Holy Triduum with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, bringing to life the institution of the Holy Eucharist, and the commissioning of the apostles to serve as Jesus has served through the washing of the feet. The liturgy that evening is followed by a Eucharistic Vigil at the gym, reminiscent of the evening that Jesus spent with his disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane. The following Good Friday is a somber day which starts with a morning prayer in church, and a solemn Stations of the Cross at noon. The Liturgy of the Veneration of the Cross happens at mid-afternoon (3:00PM), faithful to the proper hour of great mercy. On Saturday, we will have morning prayer, and then a blessing of Easter Baskets at 12:15PM. Finally, the most solemn mass of the year, the Easter Vigil, will be extra special this year as we bless the new fire, renew our baptismal promises, and welcome our catechumens to full communion with the Catholic Church. It is undoubtedly my most favorite liturgy in the year. As we arrive at the conclusion of lent and enter the glorious season of rebirth, Easter Sunday will provide many opportunities to celebrate mass: 7:15AM at church, 9:00AM masses at church and the gym (no more livestreamed overflow, it will be a live mass with another priest), 9:30AM at Saint Francis High School Slant Dome gym, and two more 10:45AM masses in the church and in the gym (again, no more livestreamed overflow, but a live mass with another priest). I hope that this will be a time to really celebrate the victory of Jesus on the cross. I pray that every person, every family, every small community that celebrates the triumph of Jesus over sin and death may experience the profound meaning of the Season of Easter.

OBSERVE THE SOLEMNITY OF THIS HOLY WEEK. Whether or not you are able to participate in the flesh with any or all of our liturgies, I extend an all-embracing invitation to observe this Holy Week with great intentionality. Make this the best Holy Week ever by keeping a solemn disposition, an awareness in prayer, a willing spirit to interiorize the spirit of this week. Play some good Catholic Christian worship music, pray devotions, watch and engage the Stations of the Cross online, read and reflect on the Scripture readings of the week, be kinder to those around you, observe a solemn fast and abstinence, and keep a joyful spirit.

Know with your heart that I am lifting you all in my prayers, my dear parishioners. May this Holy Week allow us to enter a multitude of grace, that the Lord Jesus may live in and through us always. A Blessed Holy Week to us all. Amen.





At the end of the National Eucharistic Congress last year, Bishop Cozzens announced there would be a National Eucharistic Pilgrimage from Indianapolis to Los Angeles in 2025.

Upon being asked, Bishop Hicks gratefully accepted the honor for the Diocese of Joliet to be the first Diocese on the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage St. Katharine Drexel Route.

The Diocese of Joliet will receive the Eucharist from the Pilgrims and Chaplains coming from Mass in Indianapolis, IN on Sunday, May 18 and we will present the Eucharist to the Diocese of Peoria at St. Patrick Parish in Seneca, IL on Monday, May 19.




