

UNCONDITIONAL HAPPINESS: AN EASTER MESSAGE

Happy Easter, my dear parish family! I am very excited and grateful to have had the opportunity to journey the Lenten season with you and celebrate the greatest of our liturgies during the holy triduum. This season is always glorious and beautiful. And now we have arrived at the apex of our annual liturgies – the Eastertide! Easter is a season of true and unconditional happiness. This may sound strange, but it is at the heart of our Christianity that we are called to genuine happiness, and we have all the reason for it – that Jesus conquered sin and death, so that we may have life with Him forever! Alleluia.

The idea of unconditional happiness may seem strange to some people, including well-meaning faithful Catholics, because we have been so used to hearing conditions when it comes to happiness, thanks to our consumerist culture. Some people think of happiness as a decision we make once we get what we want: "Ah, if you give me a deal on this new car, I'll be happy to buy it" or, "I will be happy to move to the new parish, as long as it is in this building... if not, you will not find me there!" or another everyday thought might be "If only people behaved like me, I wouldn't have to be so angry all the time!" These might be some familiar versions of this conditional happiness.

But the Church is at the time of its history where we are now supposed to embrace spiritual joy, or true happiness, without any ifs or buts. Why? If I should say it again – Jesus rose from the dead and triumphed over our sin and death. That is the one final condition of true happiness. Everything else does not hold water.

Early Christians were so familiar with this unconditional happiness. They joyfully embraced martyrdom for the sake of their witness to Christ. It is so hard for many people to understand martyrdom today, because we are so used to thinking that we have to get what we want, yes whatever condition we put on the way, in order to click the like icon or drop the approval vote. We frown upon the idea that Christianity is not here to satisfy our pet peeves and conditions, but it is here to proclaim the Easter message, whether it is convenient, popular or not. For the early Christians who discovered the true meaning of Christianity in the empty tomb, there was nothing else they needed in order to be happy. They went through changes, from being displaced, to being pursued, to being destroyed, to having to leave their homes, to having to see the destruction of their places of worship. But they remained steadfast through all the changes and vicissitudes of the faith journey. They remained happy, trusting in the presence of the Risen Christ, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit that was given to them from heaven.

This might very well be their theme song: "My life flows on in endless song above earth's lamentation. I hear the real, though far-off hymn, that hails a new creation. No storm can shake my inmost calm while to that Rock I'm clinging. Since Christ is Lord of heaven and earth, how can I keep from singing? Through all the tumult and the strife, I hear the music ringing. It finds an echo in my soul, "How can I keep from singing?"

Many years later, across histories, changes of times and seasons, through the placements and displacements of the Church, we find ourselves here in Wheaton. We may get tempted to feel unhappy about the uncertainties around us, or the possibility that our preferences are not heard, but alas, the heart of Christianity remains, and it is again right in our faces – Jesus Christ is alive, alleluia! Jesus is with His Church to the end of time, alleluia! Jesus is enough, alleluia!

More than ever, my dear church, we need to look at the Risen Christ. If there is any doubt in your head that you are meant to be unconditionally happy now, no matter what happens, you need to look even more closely into the message of Easter. There is absolutely, yes absolutely, no reason to be radically unhappy about anything, if we live out the freedom, the detachment, of the Easter message. I pray for unconditional happiness for you, dear church, and may the Risen Lord guide us all to the new chapters of our Easter stories. Here's to an unconditionally happy Easter Season!

From Teenager to Saint: The Roadmap of Carlo Acutis

The Catholic Church is about to name the first saint who was a "Millennial!" And he is making a big splash! In an era where young people are often seen as distant from faith, Carlo Acutis gives us an example of a new path to reality and holiness in this digital world. Born in 1991 and raised in Milan, Italy, he will be canonized on Sunday, April 27, 2025.

He grew up as a typical teenager, playing soccer, video games, and the saxophone. His young faith blossomed alongside his deep love for the Eucharist as he attended Mass daily, making it central to his life. Carlo's use of technology to spread the Gospel and document Eucharistic miracles worldwide shows how technology can be a powerful tool for good and for evangelization.

Carlo passed away from leukemia at the age of 15, inspiring multitudes of people with his courage and faith. As a celebrated role model for young people, Carlo showed that holiness is achievable at any age. One of his famous quotes is, "To always be close to Jesus!" His life and words continue to inspire us to cultivate a close relationship with Jesus through prayer, the Eucharist, Confession, visiting holy sites, and helping others in need.

Just recently, I received a letter from the pastor in Crest Hill. Last year, in Phase II of our Targeted Restructuring Process, the parishes of St. Ambrose and St. Anne were united to form one new parish. Since then, the parish has entered a process of unification and renaming. He shared with me how the parishioners actively submitted recommendations for a new name for their parish. Originally, 90 names were submitted. After discernment through listening sessions and small groups, the selection was narrowed down to the top three names. Then, those three possibilities were given to me for my final choice. All three names were strong and worthy. However, after a time of prayer and reflection, one name stood out clearly for me... Saint Carlo Acutis!

By naming the newly united parish after him, we are not just honoring his memory but also encouraging parishioners to emulate his example of living faith boldly in today's world through the Eucharist. As we strive to pass on our faith to the next generations through catechesis, evangelization, and faith in action, this newly minted saint will hopefully inspire us, both now and into the future.

If you would like to learn more about Carlo Acutis, I encourage you to see the new film, "Carlo Acutis: Roadmap to Reality." For three days, April 27-29, 2025, it will be shown in 945 theaters across the United States. Once the first 5,000 tickets are sold, the film has been guaranteed an additional three days in theaters.

I saw clips of this film at a preview during the November meetings for the *United States Catholic Conference of Bishops*. I was fascinated by the life of Carlo Acutis and his impact on the youth of today. I also learned that all proceeds from this film will benefit causes for the youth, support the further spread of the Gospel, and help fund future National Eucharistic Congresses.

I invite you to consider seeing this movie as an individual, as a family, as a youth group, and/or as a parish outing. This is a great opportunity for us to learn more about a young saint and help evangelize others by inviting them to see it. You can purchase tickets through a pre-sale program. Locations and advance ticket sales are now available at www.carloacutisfilm.com. Even if you cannot see the movie right now, I urge you to visit this website, watch the trailer, and share it with others!

Before dying from leukemia, Carlo said, "Do not be afraid because with the Incarnation of Jesus, death becomes life, and there's no need to escape: in eternal life, something extraordinary awaits us." These saintly words highlight Carlo's deep faith in Jesus and encourage us on the way to holiness.

On Sunday, April 27, 2025, with fervent devotion and enthusiastic hope, please join me and the universal Catholic Church – no matter what your age – in exclaiming, "Saint Carlo Acutis, pray for us!"




