

Looking Back to Look Forward: A Reflection on My First Year as Pastor

The end of June marks the conclusion of my first full year as your pastor here at St. Michael Church. I am deeply honored and grateful for the opportunity to serve you, and this past year has been a time of grace, learning, and deep reflection. I have tried to keep a discerning heart throughout, striving to notice how God has been at work—not only in our parish community, but within me as well.

Right now, I continue to take it one year at a time, discerning prayerfully what the Lord is asking of me. But by reflecting on this past year and recognizing the ways God has worked through me and among us, I feel renewed and encouraged to move forward in this mission.

Firstly, I give thanks for the **constant support and encouragement** I've received from so many of you. Your affirmation, prayers, and generosity of spirit have been among the most sustaining gifts of this first year. Especially in challenging or overwhelming moments, your kindness has lifted me up and kept me going.

Secondly, I am continually inspired by the <u>vibrant spirit of participation in our parish</u>. From liturgies to ministries, outreach to evangelization, so many of you give of yourselves with joy and purpose. I see new leaders emerging, youth becoming engaged, and families serving together. Our staff and volunteers work diligently to support the mission of the parish, and I am particularly encouraged by the growing presence of our Burmese youth in the reimagined youth ministry. These signs of life and engagement remind me of the goodness and potential alive in our community.

And thirdly, there have been <u>numerous highlights this year</u>—significant events and initiatives that we were able to accomplish together:

The many awe-inspiring liturgies and Eucharistic celebrations held this past year. I have never had more funerals and weddings in my 21 years as a priest!

Our Ministry Fair and Sign-Up Weekend during St. Michael's Feast Day.

The Youth Reimagined initiative and formation of a dedicated youth ministry board, together with the launch of SPARK Youth Band.

The reinstatement of the Parish Pastoral Council.

The development of internal communication structures to foster collaboration.

A new OCIA syllabus guiding the full initiation of 20 new Catholics.

Planning for the launch of the Family Faith Formation Program which begins in the new school year.

Continued growth in St. Michael's School, from stewardship to spiritual formation, especially in support of our teachers.

Strong stewardship of our facilities and capital improvements, including roofing projects, paving, and progress on the Willow Street development.

A deepening in our communal prayer life, including the visits of the relic of St. Jude Thaddeus and the pilgrim statue of Our Lady of Fatima.

A parish-wide Vision Meeting to renew clarity and focus in our mission.

The redesign of our parish website into a more dynamic and presentable platform for communication and connection. Please visit and engage with it!

These and many more in between have made me confident that **we can do great things together** and move our parish forward to champion our Catholic faith and love of God for others.

As with all the other things in life, this first year as your pastor made me stand **face to face with my own personal limitations and areas of growth.** I am equally grateful for the many moments that made me fall on my knees to beg for grace because obviously, I can never do this on my own. I need the constant providence of God.

Being your pastor is not about me, but about us. And as we look to the future, let us continue to journey together with trust in God, joy in our hearts, and a shared desire to make St. Michael not only a spiritual home, but a light for others. Fr. Bormate from the Philippines is coming July 12-13 to all Masses!

Fr. Bormate is coming to St. Michael's Parish! He is a priest in the Diocese of Borongan, Eastern Samar, Philippines. This Diocese is located on the far eastern coast of the Philippines where typhoons frequently visit causing massive destruction to homes and terrible loss of lives. The main livelihood of the locals are coconut and rice farming or fishing. Often their livelihoods are wiped out after typhoons leaving families without a way to put food on their tables or send their children to school.

In 2013, Supertyphoon Haiyan hit this area. Many lives were lost and total areas devastated! With the grace of God and the generosity of others, they are gradually recovering, even 12 years later.



Fr. Bormate will be speaking about an effort of the Borongan Diocese to help children from poor families be educated. Though high school and college costs are

high, some elementary schools are free to attend. But these poor families don't even have the means to provide school supplies, uniforms or transportation for the children to go to these free schools.

Education truly can break the terrible cycle of poverty, it can be the hope of the future for children everywhere, especially children from desperately poor families.

Fr. Bormate will tell his stories at all July 12-13 Masses. He will surely touch your hearts!

Around the Parish

St. Michael's Outreach Supports Our Community in Many Ways

Through the generosity of many St. Michael's volunteers and your regular contributions to the *Archangel Needy Fund* envelope and 'We Share' on-line giving, St. Michael's Outreach Commission is helping to make a difference in meeting the most urgent needs of our DuPage community. As Jesus said, "By their fruits you will know them"- and hours of volunteer work by members of St. Michael parish, and through our donations to important causes, our parish is a living witness of that. Recent Outreach donations have gone to help feed the hungry, minister to the ill, protect the unborn, assist the needy who come to our door, and provide housing and counseling for families in distress. We are also now beginning a relationship with *Exodus World Service* which helps legal immigrants resettle in America after leaving UN camps near war zones.

Specifically, through your generosity The Outreach Commission has recently donated to:

St. Vincent DePaul - whose members answer the call to help residents of the Wheaton community who are experiencing threats to maintaining their homes or finding a place to live due to personal and financial crises. SVD volunteers from St. Michael meet with these people in person and try to structure a help line to them. In June the Outreach Commission donated \$4,000 to help meet the urgent needs of funding for this effort.

A Stable Life (Bridge Communities) - St. Michael has been sponsoring a family consisting of a single mother and her children as she learns to be self-supportive and earn enough money to be able to get her own home. Family tutors from St. Michaels have helped the young mother create goals for her family's future, keep food on the table, and provide housing while they are getting established. This family is expected to be living on their own by the new year.

Food Pantries - Your donations to the *Archangel Needy Fund* help provide food for hundreds of hungry families in our area. Through the fund, we help support three local food pantries: *Interfaith Food Pantry* in Carol Stream, *Peoples' Resource Center* in Wheaton, and *Glen House Food Pantry* in Glen Ellyn. In addition to our recent donation of \$2,000 to each of these programs, we have St. Michael's volunteers that put in many hours of service at each of these important programs.

CUHA - (Citizens United for Hardship Assistance) is a Wheaton support organization that is sponsored by many of our area churches. CUHA helps provide professional help and counseling for individuals in our area who need more than financial assistance. St. Michael has been a member of this important source of aid for many years and continues to provide support of \$3,000 per year.

Right to Life - Protecting the lives of the most vulnerable among us is one of the most fundamental of Catholic teachings. Through Outreach, St. Michael supports three organizations –*Waterleaf, The Caring Network,* and *Project Love*- all of which focus on protecting the unborn by encouraging expectant mothers to protect the life of their unborn children. Earlier this year through the *Baby Bottles for Life,* St. Michael provided over \$6,500 to *Waterleaf* and Outreach has made recent donations of \$1,500 to both *The Caring Network* and *Project Love* to help in their efforts to protect life.

Evergreen House - A year ago St. Michael started helping this Carol Stream organization which focuses on women who are recovering from alcoholic and drug addictions by providing a group home and counseling while they continue to work and build their lives. This year the Outreach Commission has donated \$1,000 to *Evergreen House* on behalf of St. Michael Church to help continue this work.

Viator House - When 'unaccompanied children' enter the country, they are detained and placed in the custody of the Department of Health and Human Services. When these children turn 18 years old, they are no longer able to remain in juvenile detention facilities. *Viator House* provides a home for young men so that they don't end up in temporary shelters, detention centers, or unsafe situations. *Viator House* offers housing, food, clothing, case management, and spiritual support to help these young men develop the gifts and talents they hope to contribute to our nation. Outreach has donated \$500 recently on behalf of St. Michael to support these efforts.

Exodus World Services - Exodus equips Christians to walk beside refugees who have fled war or persecution in their home countries and are now rebuilding their lives in the Wheaton area. Volunteers provide mentorship, English language skills, and more. We now have several St Michael volunteers helping at *Exodus* and Outreach is also providing \$1,000 to help with the support of this excellent local program.

On behalf of all these organizations and the hundreds of adults and families that are being helped, The Outreach Commission would like to **thank all the members of St. Michael** who donate to the *Archangel Needy Fund* online or through the envelope provided in the packet mailed by the church, and who volunteer to help the less fortunate. Through your generosity of time, talent and treasure, St. Michael parish is truly bringing Christ's teachings to life in our community.

A person who is forced to flee their country due to a well-founded fear of persecution based on race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion. Most likely they are unable to return home or are afraid to do so. They are in our country legally.

Volunteers will need to submit a volunteer application, go through cross cultural training, and a background check.




