



#### Dear Parishioners,

"Glory to God in the highest!" With two exceptions, we haven't heard these words sung at Mass for the past four weeks. They are, of course, the opening words to the Gloria, and we've been fasting from them during Advent. It's a fitting fast, since these words were first sung by the angels who came to bring glad tidings of great joy to the shepherds in Bethlehem: "Today a Savior is born...Glory to God in the highest!" The angels have been silent during Mass in Advent so that they could cry out all the louder at Christmas. We will hear these words again during Lent - not on the lips of angels this time, but of the disciples as Jesus enters Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. These words mark the threshold, then, of both Jesus' birth and death. And they point to the fact that Jesus' birth is just as serious as His death and His death just as joyful as His birth. And this is the essence of Christian hope. For the Christian, hope differs as much from optimism as joy does from happiness. Happiness, in the sense of emotional satisfaction, is not always possible. And an optimistic attitude is not always realistic. But for the Christian, hope and joy are always possible and always realistic. The Christian can say "Glory to God in the highest" both in the face of the Manger and of the Cross. Even when the shadow of the Cross lies on the Manger, even when new life is threatened by death, we can rejoice, because we know that the shadow of the Manger also lies on the Cross: God brings new life out of death! "Glory to God in the Highest!" May the hope which fills these words - the hope ushered in by the birth of our Savior—fill your hearts, and the hearts of your loved ones, this Christmas season.

#### Reflection questions for Sunday, January 2nd



- The prophet Isaiah foresaw a time of great joy for Israel when nations and kings would come to Israel praising the Lord. How do you show gratitude to the Lord for the great joys of your life?
- It was revealed to Paul that God intended to save all people (Jews and Gentiles) through his Son, Jesus Christ. Paul tried to convey the significance of this revelation to the Ephesians by using the language of "coheirs" and "copartners." What does this language signal to you?
- The visit of the magi is one of the most well-known stories from the Gospel infancy narratives. It was an event that manifested God's revelation of His newborn Son to the world. It also foreshadowed the threat that some would experience because of Jesus. How does Jesus challenge the status quo even today?

### SOLEMNITY OF MARY MOTHER OF GOD & EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The Church always celebrates the **Feast of the Holy Family** the Sunday between Christmas and New Year's; this year that falls on December 26. We have the model of the Holy Family to help guide our families in how to stay focused on what's important, and don't we all need that reminder these days! Take some time this week as a family and make a plan about how you sense God asking you to begin to pray through Joseph, Mary, and Jesus. My suggestion — create a prayer that is offered by each member of the family asking for the protection of their hands and for the closeness to their hearts!

Our Church surely loves to celebrate! January 1 is more than the beginning of the calendar year — we celebrate the **Solemnity of Mary Mother of God!** What a fitting way to bring in a new year, by entrusting and believing that all we do is guided by the Hands of our Heavenly Mother. For 2022, this day is not celebrated as a Holy Day of Obligation, but at St. Charles, we want to give you an opportunity to honor our Blessed Mother with additional times to come to Mass and give Her permission to be your EVERYTHING this new year! What a great time to renew the prayer you made to the Holy Family the week before!

The Church continues pretty immediately to invite us to participate in the weekend Mass schedule (altered a little, so please see the schedule), which for us this year is actually the **Epiphany of the Lord.** Generally connected with the coming of the three kings, it is at this moment that Jesus is revealed to humankind, represented by those who traveled to see Jesus. The church term for this would be a 'theophany.' Will we give God permission to be revealed to us, at work, at home, at school, by those who frustrate us, by those who love us? Will we travel into our prayer at home and at Mass to meet Jesus, who has come to Save? Traditionally we write the initials of the three kings between the current year - in Latin these initials also invite a prayer of blessing over our house, office, or room. I encourage you to write 20 + C + M + B + 22 above the doors you walk through so that when you look up, you will remember that you are not alone!

The food pantry will close when Arrowhead Schools close for inclement weather. It will reopen the following week weather permitting.




