A Star is Born

Today we celebrate the Epiphany when the revelation of Jesus was made known to the magi through nature. It wasn't like the shepherds who had an angel appear to them to announce the coming of the Savior, but instead, the news comes through the workings of the universe in the form of a star. Given the prominence that is placed on the "star's rising" it must have been a significant event in the night sky. I wonder what it looked like?

In the final episode of season one of *The Search*, former astronaut General Kevin Chilton describes what it was like to be in space and to see the sunrise over the earth for the first time. He describes the sun as not being yellow, red, or pink, but a brilliant white light. And instead of having a light background like the sky, the background was space so it was the darkest black he had ever seen. He compared the experience to holding his first child in his arms... life-changing.

I wonder if the magi knew that the star they saw would be life-changing or were they just so curious they couldn't help but follow the star? What about us? Do we seek Jesus in such a way that it is life-changing or do we just follow because we are curious where it will lead us? Are we willing to follow the lead of the magi to lay our gifts at the feet of Jesus or are we waiting for another star?

FINANCE COUNCIL UPDATE

Hello fellow parishioners,

I missed an update for you in October, so this month, you'll have both October and November.

Our church support was right around \$50,000 in October on 4 weekend Masses and \$68,000 in November over 5 weekends (the last weekend in October was deposited on November 1st.) Both months were just a few thousand less than what we had originally budgeted. However, the combined shortfall was made up in a special bequest in November of just over \$38,000! Our staff is doing a great job in controlling our expenses and the last 2 months were right around \$51,000 in each month. This was nearly \$20,000 less than originally budgeted.

After the first 5 months of the year, we have a net deficit of (\$25,000) on collections of \$277,000. This compares to the first 5 months of last fiscal year that showed a deficit of (\$120,000) on collections of \$260,000. The large deficit improvement is due to 3 key areas: additional collections of \$17,000, reduced expenses through the first 5 months of \$20,000, and two very generous one-time gifts that we received this year totaling \$68,000.

What is the Epiphany House Blessing with Chalk?

This is a blessing for our homes that echoes two traditions.

First, since the chalk markings are placed above the door on the lintel, we are

reminded of the Israelites who marked their lintels with lamb's blood in Egypt, so the angel of the Lord would pass over their homes in the darkness of the night, protecting their first born.

Second, the chalk markings also bear the initials of the wiseman who journeyed to pay homage to Jesus the newborn king.

The blessing involves using chalk to mark the entrance to our homes with the following symbols:

$$20 + C + M + B + 22$$

The 20 refers to the first two numbers of the current year. C is for Caspar, M is for Melchior, and B is for Balthasar. The 22 represents the last two digits of the current year.

The three letters also stand for the Latin phrase *Christius Mansionem Benedicat* or "May Christ Bless this House."
