Silence is Golden

We are all familiar with the saying, "The squeaky wheel gets the grease." It is usually meant to emphasize that those who scream the loudest will get attention. Is it just me, or does it seem like this is the only form of communication remaining in the world? It feels like voices just keep getting louder and louder and even though some voices need to be heard, they get lost because after a while, everything gets tuned out because we just can't handle the volume any longer.

The reading from Isaiah tells of the one who will "bring justice to the nations" not by shouting or by crying out, but by teaching and living the word of God. Along with that, they will bring peace and not violence. This is a prophecy from Isaiah that was just as shocking in his time as it is in ours. I wonder if we can even imagine a world where those that bring peace are the ones who are revered?

Today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The first public recognition that Jesus is the one who is to redeem Israel. What strikes me about this event is that Jesus does not shout, "I am the Messiah!" or try to gather an army to conquer worldly forces. Instead, the Holy Spirit comes down like a dove. No yelling, no violence, and yet his baptism will change the world by making the water holy for all those that follow. How might we emulate this in our own lives?



Choice

Abortion advocates do not want to talk about facts or science, but they love to talk about "choice." They refuse to be called "pro-abortion," but they gladly accept the label, "pro-choice."

Indeed, nothing has so clouded and confused the politics of the abortion debate more than the misconstrued

application of this word. For years, abortion advocates have sought to bestow upon "choice" a nobility of its own, thereby avoiding discussion of what is being

chosen.

The fact is that "choice" is nothing apart from the context to which it is applied. Laws against rape, murder, assault, theft, and drunk driving (to name a few) are all "anti-choice." They remove choice in order to protect a more fundamental freedom.

In the final analysis, we are only free to choose so long as that choice does not harm another person. For

example, a person cannot choose to rape another person because rape is a violent assault on another human being. And so is abortion.
