

#### **MUSINGS FROM THE DEACON CAVE**

#### Where Does Your Water Flow?

I have been on a few trips on the western side of Lake Superior. Once you get past Duluth, the towns are pretty sparse, but the landscape is spectacular. There are so many great things to see in this remote area of the country including the famous Split Rock Lighthouse. But if you keep going about 25 miles southwest of the Canadian border is Judge Magney State Park. If you hike north a mile, you can see a spectacular sight. The Brule River splits into two sections over the volcanic river bed. Half of the river flows down a 50-foot waterfall and the other half falls into a huge hole in the rock. It is known as Devil's Kettle Falls. There is a lot of mystery surrounding the kettle because no one is 100 percent sure where the water goes once it goes into the hole. Nothing thrown into the hole is ever visible down the river. One person even poured in dozens of ping pong balls with his telephone number and a reward if someone found one. No luck. Scientists believe that the water simply comes up underneath the river downstream and objects are obliterated in the currents of the kettle so they are not seen again.

In our first reading today, we hear of Ezra reading out of the Book of Law for half a day at the Water Gate in front of everyone old enough to understand. This gate likely supplied about 90% of the water for Jerusalem, so the significance of Ezra using this location was likely to emphasize that the Word of God supplies life to the peoples just as much as the water that flowed from the gate. The question is, "What do people do with the Word of God once they hear it?" The question is the same for us.

God comes to us in many ways, but I think in a special way through the Scriptures. It is given with the purpose of nourishing us so that we can share it with others. Like the Brule River, do we let the Word of God continue to flow through us and out into the world or do we just take it in without any sign of where it goes?

#### **Parish Cancellations**

With winter fully upon us, the chance for weather-related cancellations increases. We are revising the way we send out notifications when conditions make it prudent to cancel events at the parish. These changes reflect our current leadership structure and modes of communication available to our parish.

If Fr. Paul is unable to celebrate Mass on the weekend, we will make every effort to find another priest. If we are unsuccessful, we will notify local **TV and radio** as soon as we can as well as placing a notice on the home page of our **website** and sending out a **Flocknote**. You are welcome to attend Mass at another parish if you feel you can do so safely. We will also lead the approved Sunday Celebration in the Absence of a Priest.

If we need to cancel parish events, we will place a notice on the home page of our **website** and send out a **Flocknote**. If you do not have access to the internet or email, please call the parish office if there are questionable weather conditions. Our policy is to cancel events if the local schools cancel after school activities.

#### Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest

This text allows for a deacon or lay-leader to preside at a weekend liturgy when the absence of a priest cannot be avoided. Before beginning, an announcement will be made stating the situation and where Mass is available at other local parishes. The liturgy uses the readings of the day, a homily (or reflection from a lay leader), prayers of the faithful, the Lord's Prayer and distribution of communion. This liturgy fulfills the Sunday obligation.

#### **Shopping With Scrip Made Easy**

**Remember**: You will receive 100% worth of goods or services from the Scrip that you pick. For example, if you buy a \$100 Woodman's gift card you will be able to purchase \$100 worth of food at Woodman's with the card.

St. Bernard Parish receives a small percentage of each Scrip card that is sold, approximately 2.5%-5% for most cards. This helps support all parish ministries.


