



Tickets for Christmas Masses

Our parish staff is preparing for Christmas during this difficult time of COVID-19. We want to give parishioners the opportunity to come to Christmas Mass, but we also want to maintain a safe environment. To stay within the capacity of 250 people per Mass, we are adding an extra Mass on Christmas Eve. Masses on Christmas Eve will be at 3 PM, 5 PM, 7 PM, and 9 PM, and Mass on Christmas day will be at 9 AM. The 3 PM Mass will be livestreamed, and there will be Communion Service after Mass.

To make sure that we can safely distance, tickets are needed for all the Christmas Masses (no entrance without tickets). To reserve your tickets, please call the Parish Office at 336-4033. **Please do not come to the Parish Office to pick up your tickets.** After the Weekend Masses this upcoming weekend as well as the Third Sunday of Advent, the reserved tickets will be available for pick up in the Gathering Space. Please make sure you only reserve tickets that you are actually going to use.

We surely realize that possibilities are limited, but given the circumstances, this is what we can offer. Once again: if you are older or have underlying health concerns, please do not hesitate to stay at home.

Communion for the Homebound

Due the COVID-19 pandemic, many of our parishioners do not feel comfortable coming to church. I understand that, especially those who are older, have underlying health issues, or anxiety. They are better staying safe at home. As a parish, we try to serve those who stay at home, with live streaming Masses and offering Communion Services. As you probably know, the 8:15 a.m. Masses on Sundays and the 8:45 a.m. Masses on Wednesdays are live streamed. The Communion Service is held on Sundays from 11:15 - 11:30 a.m.



The last couple of months, I have seen an increase in the number of people who carry out the Eucharist for a family member or a friend. Even though I assume that people who do this good work know how to treat the Eucharist with respect and reverence, I want to remind you again.

As Catholics, we believe that Jesus is present among us in the Holy Eucharist. Therefore, Communion is the most eminent way to meet Jesus in this life. Since the early centuries of the church, it is customary to bring the Eucharist to those who are homebound. Justin Martyr, in the second century, mentions already that “the deacons communicate to each of those present and carry away to the absent the consecrated bread, wine, and water.” Although Communion for the homebound belongs to our tradition, it is relatively new that lay people carry the Eucharist to the homebound. I remember my mother telling me that, when she grew up, she and her siblings knelt along the roadside when the priest passed with the Blessed Sacrament. They knew the priest carried the Blessed Sacrament with him since he wore a stole and held his hand on his heart, where he carried the Blessed Sacrament in his breast pocket. At that time, the task to carry the Eucharist was exclusively reserved for the priest. Even though the priest and the deacon are still the first assigned to serve the Eucharist to the faithful, it is good, and also necessary, that other faithful share in this ministry. Thank God for our trained Eucharistic Ministers, who serve the Church by distributing the Eucharist with reverence.

Along with the priest, the deacons, and the Eucharistic ministers, we see an increasing number of lay people who take Communion to the homebound in their families. Here are the “don’ts” around this service to your neighbor. When you carry the Eucharist away from church to the homebound, “reverence” is the key word. Realize that the Lord is present in the Eucharist that you carry with you. That means that you need a worthy container to take the Eucharist in, called a pyx. If you do not have a pyx, ask me, Deacon Mike, or a sacristan if you can borrow one from the parish. If you carry the Eucharist out of the church in a pyx, do not put it in the pocket of your pants. In my opinion, that is unworthy. You are better off putting it in your breast pocket or carrying it in a purse, a handbag, or in a specially designed burse. I also ask you to go directly to the home of the person receiving Communion. Please do not stop to congregate and chat with other parishioners after Mass and do not go to other places. At the home of the recipient, after making the Sign of the Cross, before the communicant receives Communion, you can pray for God’s mercy. If you want, you can also read the Gospel of the day or just move directly to the “Our Father.” Then, give Communion by presenting the host saying, “Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.” The recipient answers, “Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed,” followed by receiving Holy Communion. After a moment of silence, you can pray a prayer of thanksgiving with the communicant and close the service with the Sign of the Cross.

Thanks to all who do the good work of serving our neighbors by giving them the opportunity to meet the Lord in the Eucharist. Let us continue this good work mindfully and worthily.

Church Chair Project

You may have noticed recently that many of the chairs have been missing from church. After 20 years, the fabric on them was faded and worn. A team of parish volunteers, headed by Buildings and Grounds Committee member, **Rick Johnson**, took on the task of removing all of the cushions from the chairs to have them reupholstered. When they started the project, the team realized that this would be a bigger job than anticipated as the chairs also needed to be stained and varnished again.

Between October 20 and November 25, **295 volunteer hours** were put in. Cushions were removed, and all 192 chairs were stained and varnished. Our maintenance team, Tom Rockstroh and Stan Sukowaty, will take care of putting the chairs back together as the cushions are completed. As you can imagine, we could have never completed a project of this magnitude without the generosity of this dedicated group of volunteers, many working several days a week.
