




At rest in the Lord + + +

Christmas, a Feast of Tenderness

A project we started in my former parish was the “Christmas Inn.” We invited elderly people who did not have family over for Christmas and those who were single to celebrate Christmas together in the parish. The program always started with Mass in the morning and ended with a Christmas dinner. As their pastor, I usually joined them for dinner, and I cooked one of the courses of the meal. During the day, they had a program with music, activities, and sharing Christmas stories. The ministry was very much appreciated by the attendees because it took them away from their loneliness. I’m telling you this because a story shared by one of the attendees was the most touching Christmas story I ever heard.



The man who told the story was an elderly man and the story took place in his childhood. As an orphan, he used to live in an orphanage that was run by sisters. The sisters were very disciplined and strict, and they did not accept any mischief from the kids. On Christmas, there was always a small treat for the children in the orphanage. Even though it was a small treat, living under simple circumstances, it was really a surprise for them. That year, all of the children got a cutie orange, but for some reason, the sisters did not give him a cutie. Even though he could not think of any misbehavior in that time, the sisters told him that it was a punishment. All the other orphans felt sorry for him, and they all shared one part of their cuties. They put all the parts together, and together it made a whole cutie. Now no one was without cutie, and they all shared in the joy of Christmas. What a touching story! These little orphans, all damaged by life and the struggles they went through, shared with their friend so that he could share in the joy of Christmas as well. These little ones understood what is Christmas about, but the sisters missed it.

Christmas is a feast of tenderness. The majestic God becomes man, one of us human beings, in a little child in a manger. The great God shows himself in a little child. It is one of the paradoxes of Christianity, but a reality for us, the faithful. The rulers of the world of Jesus’ time lived in their castles, but He was born in a simple barn. People feared rulers like Pilate and Herod, but the ruler of all creation comes to us a vulnerable child. Until the time of the birth of Jesus, God guided his people Israel through commandments and prophets, but with Christmas, he starts something totally new. As a human being, God turns toward us and that changes the understanding of God radically. Like a Jewish professor of mine once said, “Jesus gives a hearth to the law.” What used to be cold becomes warm and filled with love. God shows his human face to us, a face of love and compassion. It is no longer about following rules and commandments; it is now about a relationship with Him.

I am sure that we will not forget Christmas 2020 easily. It was the year of the pandemic, and we are still in the midst of it. We long to go back to a normal life, but we are not there yet. Thankfully, there seems to be light at the end of the tunnel. Around this time all over the world, health care workers are starting to vaccinate people against this horrible disease that has taken so many lives. The vaccine is probably the biggest Christmas gift of 2020. The pandemic also brought us some good things. I have seen a lot of kindness, compassion, creativity, and love, and I hope that we carry these good things on into the New Year, into the time after the pandemic.

Even though we are not supposed to gather with big groups, I hope you have people around you to celebrate Christmas with. On behalf of the whole parish staff, I wish you all a Merry Christmas and God’s blessings for 2021!

Qualified Charitable Distributions

An individual who is at least 70-1/2 and owns an IRA can make Qualified Charitable Distributions to charities directly from their IRA. These distributions are not counted as taxable income but do count toward the required minimum distribution. These distributions can be made for regular parish support or for special donations such as capital needs. These distributions must come directly from the trustee of the IRA and not pass through the participants' hands, so please consult your tax adviser and your IRA trustee for details on how to take advantage of this benefit. 
