Do Whatever He Tells You

Dear Friends,

On January 1, 2022, my niece Katrina got married! It was an amazing day! As a family, we knew that Katrina and Dylan picked that date to bring some happy memories to it. Over the years, I have come to hate January 1 since we lost three family members, all on my mother's side of the family. Twenty-five years ago, we lost our Aunt Gerri. She was 50 years old. Fifteen years ago, we lost my mom, Harriet, to cancer. She was 66 years. And one year ago, we lost our Uncle Kevin due to complications from COVID. He was 58 years old. I always thought of Kevin as more of a cousin than an uncle because he is only a couple of years older than I am, so it is odd to call him Uncle. So you can understand our apprehension when Katrina and Dylan picked January 1 as their wedding date, not to mention wondering what the weather could be like on that date. There was a whole lot of prayer happening before their wedding day!



The gospel reading that Katrina and Dylan chose for their wedding was the Wedding Feast at Cana, which is also today's gospel reading. We usually get this gospel reading on the first Sunday back in Ordinary Time, right after Christmas. It is Jesus' first miracle. I always think of the timing of this gospel as a Christmas or Epiphany leftover since this is another time early in Jesus' public ministry that he manifests himself. What I found more miraculous was a family discussion of this gospel that ensued on Sunday as we celebrated our family Christmas. We were recounting the wedding day when my nephew Joshua brought up the gospel Katrina and Dylan had at their wedding. He liked the line "Woman, how does your concern affect me?" Josh picked up on the emotion of Jesus' annoyance because of what his mother said to him, "They have no wine." For Jewish weddings running out of wine was an embarrassment, a tragedy. It was fun listening to our younger family members discuss this gospel. As for me, having played several hundred weddings and having heard this gospel about as many times, I have come to love the line "Do whatever He tells you." I have meditated on this line many times, especially when praying the Luminous Mysteries of the rosary, where the second mystery is the Wedding Feast at Cana. I usually offer up this decade of the rosary for all newly married couples.

Over the years, I have come to think that Mary is saying this to me, "Do whatever He tells you," which is no easy feat. However, trusting in Jesus, he will give me what I need to accomplish whatever he asks of me, which is where the no easy feat part comes in. This is where some surrender of will has to happen. So here we are back in Ordinary Time, which is not so ordinary, but trusting in God, He will get us through. If we keep our eyes and ears and hearts open, He still provides those daily miracles. Happy New Year!

Matching Gifts to Nonprofits

Qualified Charitable Distributions

If you are 70 1/2 years or older and have an IRA, please consider making a year-end Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to OLOL. QCDs are limited to the amount that would otherwise be taxed as ordinary income. Those who must take a required minimum distribution (RMD) may direct up to \$100,000 annually to charitable organizations without treating the distribution as taxable income. QCDs don't require that you itemize. This means that with the recent changes to the tax laws, you may be able to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving. This gift opportunity is especially beneficial for people who do not need their required minimum distribution. QCDs, however, count toward complying with the RMD requirement. To make a gift, simply direct your IRA administrator to make a charitable distribution to OLOL. As always, consult your tax advisor.

Hearing Loop in Church

Now that we are seeing more people back in church, we wanted to remind you that Our Lady of Lourdes has a Hearing Loop for hearing aid users! The Hearing Loop was made possible by a generous donation from a parish family. Many of your have already been taking advantage of it, but here is some information that might be helpful for those who weren't aware:

What is a hearing loop and how does it work?

Hearing Loops allow people who wear hearing aids to directly receive the sound from the church's PA system in their own hearing aids without having to pick up a separate listening device.

Do you use hearing aids?

If you wear hearing instruments, you will need to find out if your hearing aids have a wireless receiver called a T-coil or Telecoil built in, in order to benefit from the hearing loop in our church. The T-coil program is accessed by pushing a button on a hearing aid and must be activated by your audiologist. Talk to your audiologist to find out if your instruments can have both a T (no background noise pick up) and an MT program (blended micro-phone & T-coil program) for improved hearing at church.

Hearing loops improve hearing aids!

Digital hearing aids have significantly improved in the last decade, but they do not restore hearing to normal. Difficulties often remain when in challenging listening situations. Hearing loops help hearing aid users overcome

this problem by broadcasting sound without background noise or reverberation.

<u>MARRIAGES</u> - Weddings to initiate Christian Marriage are celebrated for persons who have demonstrated an active practice of our Faith. At least six months notice is required for the required Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program. New parishioners contemplating marriage in our parish must be registered with the parish and show active participation for at least 6 months prior to setting a wedding date. Weddings can be scheduled any time on Friday afternoons or on Saturdays, no later than 1:00 p.m.
