
Winter and Mass

The Word of God

This weekend is all about the Word of God. That sounds a little odd because we read the Word of God at every Mass. But this weekend is different. This weekend, we go back to the foundation of why the Word of God has become part of our Catholic faith. It's why-we-do-what-we-do.

In the first reading we hear about Ezra. Ezra was a priest when the Jews came back from Babylonian Exile. As the people returned to Jerusalem, they saw the ruins of their temple...their church. And while others were concerned with rebuilding that temple, Ezra was concerned with rebuilding the Church. Not "the church," the building, but "the Church," the people of God. To help rebuild the Church, he needed to start back at the foundation. So he went out and publicly read God's word. He did something unheard of at the time. He took the scrolls, unrolled them in front of

the people, and proclaimed them to all who were listening. But not only did he proclaim the Word, Ezra "broke it open" for the people. He interpreted God's Word for the people so they could understand it. He showed them how it was relevant to

them. And Ezra led a spiritual revival (not just in word but in deeds) during a time of despair.

The story of Ezra leads us right into this weekend's Gospel. We find Jesus this weekend in Luke's Gospel, going through all of Galilee proclaiming God's Word. He too, "broke it open" for the people. Interpreting the sacred words and explaining it to the people so they could understand it. And finally, when in Nazareth, Jesus reads God's Word (spoken by the Prophet Isaiah) about who He was and why He came. His Word was not just ink on scrolls, it was Word in action. Jesus was anointed by the Spirit to bring glad tidings, to proclaim liberty, to recover sight, to free the oppressed, and tell the world about Him. His Word was relevant hundreds of years later.

And those same words are alive and relevant today. When we hear the Word of God proclaimed at our Mass or read the Word of God in our homes, these are not just words in a book. These are Words of action. When the Word is "broken open for us" during the Mass, we should see how these words matter today. God's Word is still pertinent to our times and in our lives. My challenge: open up the Word of God. Read the daily readings or listen to a Bible podcast (I highly recommend Fr. Mike Schmitz's "Bible in a Year"). Meditate on what you read or heard—and then live it. As Christians, that's what we are called to do.


