

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Our Lady of Lourdes,

Welcome to Catholic Schools Week 2022! As you enter our church building this weekend, you will notice our narthex decorated with artwork and projects created by Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic School students. You will also be greeted by many members of our school's faculty, administration, and parish families who have enrolled their sons and daughters in our school, as well as many of our students themselves. Further, our students, donning their bright yellow "Lourdes' Way" shirts with this year's theme and mission boldly proclaiming, "Arise, SHINE!," will serve on various ministries at the 10:15 AM Mass. Additionally, recent OLOLCS alums will speak briefly after Holy Communion to share with all of us the formative and lasting effect our school has had on their young lives. Some of our alums who are away at college will offer recorded messages playing in the church narthex. These young alums represent us incredibly well at the high schools and colleges they have chosen to attend, and local employers benefit so greatly from the gifts they share in the workplace. I am sure we will all enjoy their "heightened" presence and participation at Masses this weekend!

It is my hope that much of what we encounter during this week will become "the norm" here at Lourdes. Certainly not every weekend with such great grandeur, but the presence and participation of our school community in the parish is an absolute necessity if our school is to fulfill its Roman Catholic mission. Towards that end, our school and parish administrations will continue to find ways that the parish and school will consistently exercise a collaborative and unified approach to nurture Christian discipleship: we are not about establishing a "private school," but rather a "Catholic school." I

look forward to sharing with our school community such opportunities for greater connectedness.

Well before my ordination to the priesthood, I was a staunch proponent of Catholic education, as you may have witnessed. It has been my joy to serve on the faculty at Willebrord Catholic High School in Chicago, at Abbot Pennings High School in De Pere, and at Saint Norbert College. And throughout the entirety of my priesthood, I have continued service to Catholic educational apostolates through either memberships on the Board of Education [at Notre Dame de la Baie Academy,] or through ongoing "Trustee Ministry" at Saint Norbert College and at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago. Especially amidst the complexity of cultural shifts in the world that often finds folks seemingly at odds with one another amidst differing mindsets, ideologies, philosophies, political stances, and spiritualties, Catholic education offers its students a "school of virtue" that serves as a guide, offering a sense of "order" when "chaos" so often seems to abound. As we engage with our school community to a greater degree this weekend, perhaps you will be inspired to do one or two or even all of the beautiful encouragements described on the next page.

Since my return to Lourdes, most of my Wednesday nights are spent engaging with our parish community at religious education classes. This gives me an opportunity to interact with a huge demographic of our parish community: our young students, our parents, and our volunteer catechists alike. I've especially enjoyed those times when I've been tapped to come into a class to teach various topics of theology where our catechists think I might be able to shed some light on a difficult topic. I am grateful that our staff and volunteers do so much to provide a decent opportunity for our young parishioners, enabling them to learn about our beautiful faith despite the limited time available for such programming.

I've been blessed to be able to engage with our young students at the school, as well. Obviously, there are more opportunities to make greater contributions at the school simply due to the availability of time allowed. At Our Lady of Lourdes, we promise to always provide for our students an atmosphere in which:

The Gospel message is proclaimed, Community in Christ is experienced, Christian Service to our sisters and brothers is the norm, Thanksgiving and worship of our God is cultivated; All the while, providing a solid and rigorous curriculum that informs, challenges, and nurtures the human intellect.

I must admit, I have many cherished memories of Catholic Schools Week from my formative years when growing up in the 1970s. That spirit continues today, specifically this week! I am arranging my schedule in such a way that I'll be able to participate in many very creative activities at Lourdes throughout the week ahead. Will you please join me in affirming the "firm foundation" we are providing for the youth of our parish? Let's endeavor to make this great gift accessible to a greater number of Faithful at Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church.




