#### National Eucharistic Revival

On October 11, some of our parish staff attended the annual Diocesan Day at the Resch Center. The day's focus was to prepare parish staff for the National Eucharistic Revival that the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) initiated and will be a focus for the next three-plus years. Why the initiative? It has been reported that 80% of Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the very lifeblood of the Church.


The day was set up as a retreat and was the best Diocesan Day I've ever attended. We began the day with Morning Prayer, which included Eucharistic Exposition, Adoration, and Benediction. Father Dave Pivonka, our fantastic keynote speaker, is an Alumnus President of Franciscan University in Steubenville and launcher of "The Wild Goose" series. Interspersed throughout the day were three inspirational witness talks about how God worked in their lives.

Bishop Ricken presented his Pastoral Letter on the Eucharist, which you can find on the front page of the Diocesan website. I would ask that you take the time to read his letter, and hopefully, here at the parish, we will be able to study his letter closely. Throughout the day, there was the veneration of Blessed Carlo Acutis and Saint Manuel Gonzalez Garcia relics. The sacrament of Confession was available throughout the day. Part of the afternoon included breakout sessions. I attended the Music & Liturgy session and connected with some fellow musicians, some of whom were old friends, but I also made some new friends. And then our day ended with Mass.

I want to say a few words about the relics we had the opportunity to venerate. Blessed Carlo Acutis died from leukemia on October 12, 2006, at 15. He was your typical kid who played sports and video games but loved the Eucharist. He developed his website, where he cataloged all kinds of Eucharistic Miracles. His feast day is October 12. The day at the Resch included prints of his Eucharistic Miracles which made for facinating reading and profound reflection about the Eucharist.

Saint Manuel Garcia is the saint of abandoned tabernacles. In one of his first assignments, he was a Bishop who was given a church that had been left. Bishop Garcia noticed that the tabernacle was full of cobwebs and dirt, not a respectable place for the Holy Eucharist. So after that experience, he began to ensure that tabernacles were kept up since they housed Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

And finally, there is one small portion that I would like to share you from Bishop Ricken's Letter "Encountering Jesus in the Eucharist." Bishop talks about "5 Alive Practices," which reminds me of some of the daily vitamins I take called "Alive."






