

God's Justice and Mercy

Justice (n.): the maintenance or administration of what is in conformity with what is morally upright or good, especially by the impartial adjustment of conflicting claims or the assignment of merited rewards or punishments

Mercy (n.): compassion or forbearance shown especially to an offender or to one subject to one's power. also: lenient or compassionate treatment

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday, a day dedicated to celebrating God's divine mercy in sending his son, Jesus, to die on the cross to pay for our sin. When we look at God's character, his justice and mercy are like the two sides of a coin. That said, as we can see when we study the definitions above, while both of these words have positive connotations, justice and mercy are actually often in opposition to one another.

In God's justice, we must pay the price for our sins. To not demand recompense would be for God not to be just. And yet, in God's love for us, he also wishes to show us mercy and allow us the opportunity to spend eternity with him in

heaven. So how can God reconcile these two aspects of his character?

The answer is simply Jesus. Jesus is the answer to how God can be both just and merciful, and that is what we celebrate today, Divine Mercy Sunday. In God's justice, he demands repayment for our sins. In his mercy, He sends His only begotten son to pay that price for us. Jesus takes on the sins of the world because God loves us so much that He can't bear the idea that we would be unable to join Him in heaven because of our fallen nature.

I think the best way to explain this is a story—a parable of sorts—that I heard, though I can't remember where:

In the South, many years ago, corporal punishment, in particular paddling, was a common form of discipline. At a particular school, there was a boy who regularly received this punishment for disrupting class or fighting with other students. He came from a rough household and was undeterred by the punishment, despite the humiliation and pain it caused him.

At the beginning of a new school year, a new principal started, a strong Christian man. Teachers and parents warned him of this troublemaker and that he should prepare for a year full of paddling. The man would simply respond, "We'll see."

Sure enough, a week into school and the boy was in his office for punching another student. The principal said, "You know I can't just let you get away with this, right? This behavior has consequences, and I intend to ensure the consequences are felt." The boy simply stared and rolled his eyes. The principal said, "The punishment is paddling.

I think this time we will do it in front of the whole school to send a message. Let's do it tomorrow.

The next day the whole school was pulled into the gym. The principal stood in the middle with the boy. The principal explained that the boy had punched another student and that there was a price to pay for such actions. "But," the principal said, "He won't be paying it today. I will pay the price for him." He handed the boy the paddle and said, "I believe 5 would be appropriate." and then waited for the boy to paddle him. The boy hesitated. The principal simply said, "The price has to be paid." The boy again hesitated. The principal said, "We cannot let your actions go unpunished. We will not leave until justice is served." He then handed the paddle to the gym teacher who followed through with the punishment.

The little hou's eyes filled with tears as the principal cripped with each paddling. Afterward, the principal told the hou.

The little boy's eyes filled with tears as the principal cringed with each paddling. Afterward, the principal told the boy, "I took your punishment today, and I will do it again, though I hope I never have to." What could not be accomplished by many acts of justice was accomplished with one act of mercy. While not perfect, the boy turned his life around. He was so afraid that his principal would once again have to take on his punishment that he made a radical change in his behavior.

Just as the principal remained true to the principle of justice (that the boy's actions required punishment), he also showed the boy mercy, by taking that punishment upon himself. So Jesus did for us two millennia ago. How often do we actually let the gravity of that hit us? How often are our choices and actions impacted by the fact that they are not without consequence, and that Jesus is the one who bore them for our sake? How often do we express our gratifude to God for this immense gift?

Today is a day for doing just that. It is one of my favorite feast days because it is a yearly reminder of God's infinite love for us. I encourage you to take some time today to thank God for this unbelievable gift.






