IT'S ABOUT LOVE!

"I love you with an everlasting love." - God

God wants you to know that it's about love - the love of Christ!


God's love transforms you. It turns the hateful, broken, bad parts of ourselves into a kindness, gentleness, and love. When God's love hits your heart, and it continually does, it changes you.

I remember a conversation a friend had with her junior-high nephew. Their discussion involved what to do about the bullying this young man was experiencing at school. One of the ideas considered was to bully the bullies right back, and don't we all feel that way sometimes. "But that would not be 'Christ love'," said the nephew. What a response! In that statement, he indicated he was rooted in God's love. The unique love that comes to us through Christ and changes us. From people who return hurt with hurt, to people who are capable of imagining a different way forward. "Christ love" calls us to forgive when others hurt us, to love an enemy, to stand up for others when they are treated wrongly, to love the stranger. The character of "Christ love" is truly special. And just think, you have been growing in this kind of love your whole life long - in worship, prayer, community, reading Scriptures. In all this, the Holy Spirit is continually empowering you to reflect "Christ love" into your relationships and thereby the world. You can't experience "Christ love" in your life and not be changed by it.

In fact, Jesus described it like this: "I give you a new command: Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you must also love one another. By this all people will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35).

It begins with God's love for us. The most interesting change in the Bible is of a man named Saul, who was a religious extremist that killed Christians. One day, on his way to Damascus, he encountered the resurrected Jesus. Jesus said to Saul, "Why are you persecuting me?" Saul fell to his knees and said, "My Lord and my God." Paul, once a religious extremist, became an apostle of God's love. In fact, Paul wrote most of the New Testament, including some of the most powerful words ever written about what love looks like in 1 Corinthians 13.

It really is all about love - the love of God made known in Jesus. It changes lives. Has it changed yours?

Ash Wednesday Worship February 17 Livestream at 7:30pm

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. The theme of the day is a call to repentance as we are told, "Now is the acceptable time... return to the Lord." The worship includes the imposition of ashes. During this part of the worship, you may mark your own forehead with ashes from your home or from a burnt candle wick or simply mark your forehead with the sign of the cross. The ashes are a symbolic reminder of our human frailty and mortality. The ashes, marked in the sign of a cross, also remind us of our baptism into Christ. It is through baptism that we are united with Jesus in both his death and his resurrection.

Lent Small Groups Sign Up Now!

Meeting via Zoom February 24, March 3, 10, 17, 24

This year our Lent small groups will study the book *One Coin Found: How God's Love Stretches to the*

Margins by ELCA pastor Emmy Kegler. The title is inspired by Jesus' parable of the lost coin in the gospel of Luke. Pastor Emmy shows us that even when we feel neglected, pushed to the edges where our voices and stories are not heard - like lost coins - God picks up a broom and sweeps every corner of creation to find us. God never stops searching until we are found again. And God is seeking out others on the margins whose voices and stories we too quickly silence and dismiss, too. Because God's story is a story of welcome and acceptance for everyone - no exceptions.

Pastor Emmy is a queer woman who grew up in both conservative Evangelical and progressive Protestant churches. She has experienced how Scripture can be used to wound and exclude. Yet the stories in Scripture captured her and inspired her. So she set out to fall in love with the Bible, wrestling with the stories inside, trying to find a place for herself within these stories. And it's there that she met a God who continues to seek us out and claim us. She writes through the lens of her queer identity, but much of what she wrestles with is common to all of us, whether or not we are part of the LGBTQ+ community. This book is for everyone.

Our Lent schedule this year differs from past years when we also included a shared meal and worship on Wednesdays.

For Lent 2021, small groups will be offered via Zoom for five Wednesdays beginning February 24.

- Morning 10:00-11:00am
- Afternoon 2:00-3:00pm
- Evening 6:15-7:15pm

At each of these times, those participating will gather via a common Zoom call for a short welcome and prayer. Then participants will automatically be divided into separate small group "break-out rooms" where a lay leader will facilitate a time of reflection, discussion, and fellowship. At the end of each session, participants will automatically be brought back to the main Zoom group to close.

Worship for all, using Holden Evening Prayer, will be livestreamed on Facebook each Wednesday evening at 7:30pm.

How can you sign up? Look in the e-weekly Moments for a link that will take you directly to a Google sign-up sheet. You will be asked for your name(s), email address, which time you prefer (10am, 2pm, 6:15pm) and how you wish to get your copy of the book. You can also call the church office to sign up. If you would like to, you can send a donation of \$10 to Midvale to cover the cost of the book. The last day to register will be Ash Wednesday, February 17.



Lent Confirmation Project

During the season of Lent, Midvale confirmation students will once again be working with Heather Dean of Creative Across Curriculum on a special arts integration unit. We will be exploring photography and personal faith journeys. This means students will explore one idea on their faith journey, from the Life of Jesus unit in semester one. Then, explore photography skills like using shade (lights and darks), using line direction, using perspective, and using subject placement to enhance meaning. Finally, students will integrate the two to create a meaningful product. The students will display and discuss their work virtually.

Sunday School in February

For the month of February, Sunday school will explore the story of Queen Esther. We thank Midvale volunteers for their willingness to record themselves from home so that participants can access the content at a time that works best for their schedule. Our unit starts out with Toni Swandby sharing the story from the NRSV version of the Bible and Cheryl Krull sharing the Spark Story version. After families have experienced the story, they are encouraged to choose one rotation each week to explore from the following options:

Science led by Ethan Fiegel. Participants will learn about lizards called, anoles. Sometimes anoles camouflage their body to blend into their environment and sometimes they purposefully stand out. This is compared to how Esther sometimes had to blend in and sometimes had to stand out and also compared to us being faithful to our calling in various situations.

Digital Tech led by Anna Mueller and Sigird Rohrer will explore modern and historical women of power and influence. They will encourage learners to choose a particular woman to learn more about. They will also lead learners in how to make a Google slide if more help is needed.

In our Art rotation led by Rachel Kleber, we will create golden crowns with dazzling jewels as we reenact the story of Esther and remember that we are children of an Almighty Sovereign.

We will have a music rotation led by our own Ann McDermott that will encourage us to continue using our drums and shakers.

Additional tie ins for this unit will include recipes to celebrate the festival of Purim.

Supplies for this unit will be distributed on Sunday, February 7. We invite families to join us for Zoom conversations on Sunday mornings February 21 and February 28.

Church Council Authorizes Additional \$20,000 to Support Basic Food, Housing and other Needs

2020 was an unprecedented year. Because of your generosity and the adaptations the staff and Council made to our ministry, Midvale ended 2020 in a strong financial position. Our leaders reduced spending in certain areas due to the inability to meet in-person, and redirected planned expenses to areas where it was most needed, including technology upgrades and COVID-19 cleaning and safety supplies. In December, the Council realized the church could further express our calling to love our neighbors with the resources we have. The Council felt this was particularly important in a time when so many are struggling. A surplus of \$20,000 was used to make contributions over and above the usual church's budgeted donations to our trusted local and national ministry partners. These contributions focused on support for people facing food and housing insecurity. The following organizations received this additional funding:

Midvale Begins Diversification of Art Collection

The pandemic has provided an opportunity for the Art and Worship Environment Committee to use its financial resources in a new way. In late fall, the committee researched art created by Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) and decided to purchase quality prints for the Midvale Art Collection. We are in the process of receiving and framing six new giclee prints that will become part of the permanent collection.

The first work is a contemporary painting by Chinese artist Dr. James He Qi (currently living in CA). The title of the work is *Peace Be Still* (print measures 22" x 22"). This work is based on Mark 4:35-41. He Qi works in Chinese ink, British watercolor, Japanese gouache (opaque watercolor) and Chinese color made from rock on Chinese rice paper. Each work tells a beautiful story. He Qi has said "Chinese people need to know that the Gospel message is not a message which belongs to Western people alone-it is a message which belongs to Eastern people too. It is a message that belongs to the whole universe." Midvale Library has purchased a book by He Qi titled *The Art of He Qi*. It features many of his works and is signed and dated by He Qi. Dr. Richard Melheim has created the preface for the book and has described He Qi's art work as follows:

It's Chagall meets Matisse meets Picasso meets East.

Vibrant. Energetic. Breathtaking. Biblical. Humorous. Whole-world art.

... I believe He Qi may one day be seen as the Michaelangelo of the next 1000 years of Christian art.

Look for articles each month in the *Community* as we feature these new prints and an exhibit in the future when we return to in-person worshipping.


