PLAY BIG

"Bucks In Six!" The day after the Milwaukee Bucks won the NBA World Championship, Wisconsinites greeted each other with those words. What a thrilling win! For the Bucks, for Milwaukee, for Giannis.

How did the Milwaukee Bucks win? ESPN reported that the Bucks completely retooled their offense for the 2021 season. It is likely that offense made the difference for the team's championship. Whether you are playing basketball or living your life, offense means being proactive. It's what we call "playing big." Defense is "playing small" or being reactive.

"Offensive vs. Defensive" are sports terms that apply to our life as a community of faith, Midvale. Sometimes we read reports of diminishing participation in the life of the church. We don't need to be reactive or defensive, because God has promised the Holy Spirit will continually sustain the life of the community of believers. In fact, here is where it's best to follow the Milwaukee Bucks strategy - focus on the offense. Retool the offense - ask what a difference church makes in somebody's life? What is God offering through a faith community? How is God "playing big" through us, Midvale? And, my favorite, why is it so fun to be together, Midvale?

David Brubaker, a professor of Organizational Science, has outlined what benefits a faith community offers:

- 1. Social Capital:** "Faith communities in which people worship together are arguably the single most important repository of social capital in America." People can forge significant relationships. Congregations bring people together with a shared purpose every week—and those regular gatherings tend to produce deep, lasting bonds.
- 2. Values Formation:** Several core values appear in nearly every major religion, including the following: The Golden Rule, Concern for the Poor, Meaning Over Money, Commitment to Community, Personal Responsibility. While there are individual congregations and even some denominations that practice a more exclusive and fear-based approach to religion, that is not the thrust of the major religions or of the majority of congregations. Since values are "caught more than taught," regular participation in the life of a healthy congregation reinforces positive values that when lived out, make a difference in our community and in our world.
- 3. Accessible Culture:** The most universal aspect of congregational life is that they produce culture. A surprising finding revealed by this study is "congregations mainly traffic in ritual, knowledge, and beauty through the cultural activities of worship, religious education, and the arts." A majority of Americans are not regular patrons of the arts, but congregations offer their community access to music, ritual, drama, and storytelling. Elementary-age children reenacting the Christmas story illustrates one of a congregation's most important functions—a place for children to learn how to perform musically, read scripture, or reenact sacred stories in a public context.

As your pastor, I affirm these three wonderful gifts offered through life in a faith community. And I want to add a fourth value that supersedes all others. We, the church, exist to proclaim God's love through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Every day is the chance to "go big" through being a part of God's mission to love, bless, and reconcile all people. God continues to retool the offense through our life as a faith community, Midvale. How can you join in God's offense, sharing the benefits of our faith community with others?

Creating Beautiful Lives: The Ideal Way of Life by Tom Lovett

This extraordinary book appeared in the midst of COVID-19 as a kind of miracle.

A miracle because, in the darkest of times, this book offers hands of light, ways to understand the potential of human beings and cultures to thrive, to move toward ideals of goodness, truth, and beauty.

The author, Tom Lovett, a member of Midvale and my husband, has explored the art of daily living for decades in extensive reading and research, the rituals that grace our days and make us most human. His perspective connects these practices to the biological and social reality of human life as the animal species *Homo sapiens*. The survival demands of our present era call for us to create a new story that encompasses what matters most in art, science, and religion.

The author hopes to attract readers to engage with these large questions of human potential in our individual and social lives. MCLC Endowment Fund Application Deadline

Consider submitting a grant request to the MCLC Endowment Fund. Do you have a unique passion or interest that you feel can enhance the Church's work? Is there a gap in the service that the Church is currently providing to our members, the community or global missions? Are there improvements in our physical building or equipment that could better meet our members' needs and broaden the Church's missions?

As we begin our year's final quarter, we are welcoming grant requests through October 15, 2021. Application forms for grant requests are available through the church office or can be sent to you via email. Although most grant requests are submitted through a church committee, some past grant requests have been submitted by individuals. If you are interested in submitting a grant request and are not sure whether it should be approved by a church committee, feel free to reach out to one of the pastors or other members of the Endowment Committee with your questions.

These three general areas guide the purpose of the Endowment Fund:

Ministry: visiting theologians, local and world mission support, health/healing ministry, congregational anniversary remembrances, campus ministry

Education: scholarships for academic or continuing education in religious studies, sponsorship of workshops/seminars or study programs, sponsorship of experiences that encourage personal growth in religion, sponsorship of a seminary chair

Facilities: special building projects and equipment purchases

What if my committee has a past grant request that is still outstanding?

This question is of particular relevance as the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in many projects being delayed or postponed. Funding for an Endowment Grant that has been approved in the past will carry over until the completion of the project.
