25 YEARS OF PASTORING

I have been a pastor for 25 years as of August 3, 2022. It is hard to believe! I am grateful to have this calling. I was ordained at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Circle Pines, Minnesota in 1997, the church I attended for most of my growing up years. My mom took me to church nearly every week. This experience nurtured my faith as well as my appreciation of the community

of meaning and purpose that the church offers. Of course, I didn't always think I would be a pastor. When I was little, I was fascinated with big vehicles, and I remember really wanting to be a school bus or a truck driver! Later, in high school, we had an assignment to research two jobs that we might want to do. I wrote about being a professional soccer player and a forest ranger.

When I started at St. Olaf College, my intent was to do something with math or science. I graduated with majors in physics and mathematics, but by the end of my college time, I felt called in another direction. After graduation I enrolled at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota and began the four year program to receive my Master of Divinity degree and be ordained as a pastor in the ELCA. There were many people and experiences that helped me discern this pathway, including pastors Phil Johnson and George S. Johnson from my home church, as well as serving as a summer counselor at two ELCA camps. One of them, Christikon, in Montana, is where Midvale's youth went this summer!

Being a pastor has been a remarkable journey. I served my internship at Grace Lutheran in Wenatchee, Washington. My first call was as an associate pastor at Community Lutheran in Rancho Santa Margarita, California, where I worked with Pastor George Miner, a great influence for me. In 2002 I came to Midvale as an associate pastor with Bruce Loewenhagen. From 2008-2014 I worked in the bishop's office, and in 2014 I returned to Midvale to serve as co-pastor with another excellent colleague, Katie Baardseth (my amazing wife!). In my 25 years as a pastor, I've backpacked with youth in the High Sierras, camped in the Boundary Waters, and led groups to the Holy Land and Germany. I've also had to deal with quite a few things they never taught me about in seminary, like when you find a rattlesnake in the church bathroom, or when the baptismal font is gushing water into the sanctuary or a global pandemic. The last two plus years have been the most difficult of any I've had as a pastor, but, for most of us, they've been the most difficult years we have experienced in our lifetimes.

Throughout the surprises, the highs and the lows of the last 25 years, I am continually encouraged, inspired and motivated by the people with whom I serve - by all of you! It is such a privilege and blessing to build relationships together so that God's love might be experienced and shared. It is a partnership and calling that we all have been given. In baptism, as well as in the rite of ordination, the charge we receive is to bear God's creative and redeeming love to all the world. May we continue to live into this holy calling together, trusting in God's grace, whatever the future may bring.

Do you have a unique passion or interest that you feel can enhance the Church's work? Is there a gap in the service that the Church is currently providing to our members, the community or global missions? Are there improvements in our physical building or equipment that could better meet our members' needs and broaden the Church's missions? As we begin our year's final quarter, we are welcoming grant requests through October 15, 2022. Application forms for grant requests are available through the church office or can be sent to you via email.

Although most grant requests are submitted through a church committee, some past grant requests have been submitted by individuals. If you are interested in submitting a grant request and are not sure whether it should be approved by a church committee, feel free to reach out to one of the pastors or other members of the Endowment Committee with your questions. Grant requests can be submitted to Pam Frey in the church office or by email to info@midvalelutheran.org.

These three general areas guide the purpose of the Endowment Fund:

Ministry: visiting theologians, local and world mission support, heath/healing ministry, congregational anniversary remembrances, campus ministry

Education: scholarships for academic or continuing education in religious studies, sponsorship of workshops/seminars or study programs, sponsorship of experiences that encourage personal growth in religion, sponsorship of a seminary chair

Facilities: special building projects and equipment purchases

This question is of particular relevance as the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in many projects being delayed or postponed. Funding for an Endowment Grant that has been approved in the past will carry over until the completion of the project.
