Question:

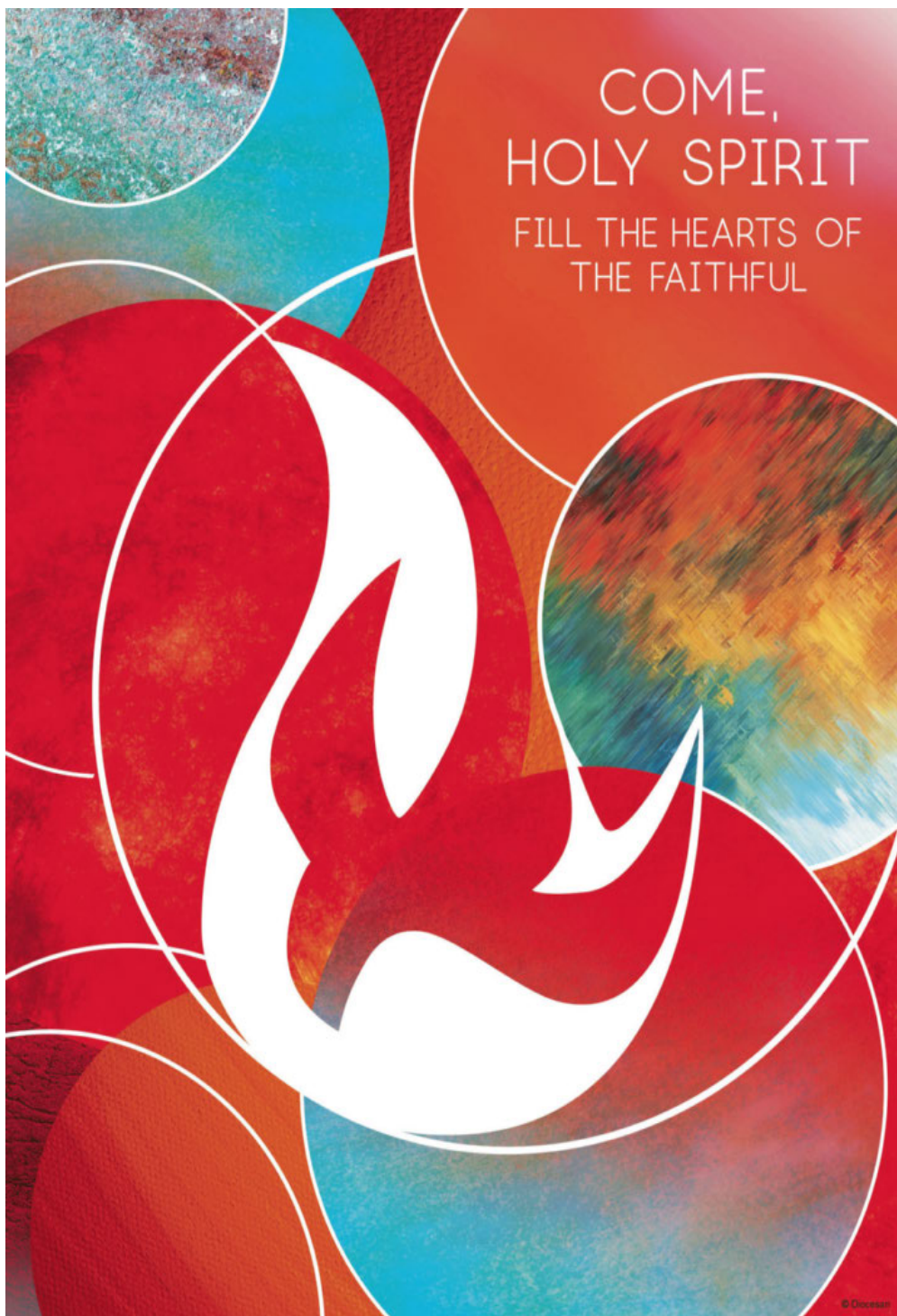
Why do we celebrate Pentecost when we do?

Answer:

The book of Acts unpacks the events immediately following Jesus' ascension into heaven. The Apostles and other disciples were told to pray in Jerusalem and await another outpouring of the Holy Spirit. As the weeks ticked on, the Jewish Festival of Weeks approached. This festival took place 50 days after Passover and celebrated the giving of the law on Mount Sinai. The Festival of Weeks (or "Pentecost" in Greek) was a great pilgrimage feast, with Jews from all over the ancient world convening on Jerusalem for the celebration.

It was on Pentecost that God chose to send the Holy Spirit. Here, the new law of love was etched into the hearts of the disciples. As he burst out onto the balcony above the multinational crowd, Peter proclaimed the message of the resurrection, and the Holy Spirit enabled every listener to hear in their native language. 3,000 people were baptized that day! The disciples — and every baptized person — receives the gifts and zeal necessary to bring a new message of salvation to the people of God.

The weekend of May 21 & 22, we were pleased to have John Michalak speak at Masses about Biking for Babies. This year Aubrie Faust, another parishioner who we have supported the past few years, is not riding so we are happy that John is able to support this worthwhile cause. Thank you for living your faith so boldly.

"Imagine a world where women don't have to make choices out of fear or convenience, but rather feel empowered to make choices out of love and purpose. Imagine a society that embraces the immeasurable worth of every human life from conception to natural death. Imagine a world in which your unique gifts and talents help others to know and understand life as a treasure. My name is John Michalak and for the second year, Biking for Babies has invited me to take part in rebuilding the culture of life. This year I will have the honor of leading as well as riding alongside 10 missionaries from Minneapolis, MN to St. Louis, MO covering over 600 miles by bike from July 10-16. We are partnered with pregnancy resource centers that are helping mothers in crisis pregnancies. These centers provide free ultrasounds and pregnancy tests. They provide free clothing, diapers, and formula which we know is now harder than it has ever been in recent memory. They provide parenting classes from birth up until age 6, and so much more. These centers are on the front lines of rebuilding the culture of life, but they cannot do it alone. PENTECOST AND THE TRIUNE GOD

Do you believe in one God or three? The mystery of the Trinity is beyond human comprehension. St. Patrick perhaps explained it best when he compared it to the shamrock. God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit. Three persons in one God. What does it even mean and why is it important? Pentecost is an important feast day in the church's liturgical year because it celebrates the infusion of the Holy Spirit in the Apostles who were in hiding at the time, afraid because Jesus was no longer there to guide them, or so they thought. They had panicked and forgotten that the Lord had told them that the Spirit would be there to guide them after He was gone. They didn't understand it at the time, but once the Holy Spirit came upon them, they understood, and went out, fearlessly, to spread the good news of salvation to the world. It is because of the Spirit that we are Christians today. And the good news is that through Baptism and Confirmation, the Holy Spirit is with each of us personally, today, to help and guide us in our lives. This is why we celebrate Pentecost and, as Catholics, consider it to be an important and essential feast.
