

A Well Deserved Thank You!

Dear Parishioners of St. Mary of the Hill,

On behalf of myself and all our wonderful volunteers I want to extend a heartfelt thank you for your tremendous generosity for the Love One Another Capitol Campaign of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. As I write this we have almost exceeded 149% of our goal. We have raised the extraordinary amount of \$684,750.00! May God reward you for all your generosity and kindness! Our Parish will be able to retain over \$477,822.00 for our Dedicated Worship Space. We are working on renderings to share with all of you in the days ahead. This is an exciting time for our Parish and I am so pleased that we are moving forward with this project.

July - Month of Carmelite Saints

The month of July is filled with Carmelite feast days. Most Saints' feasts are celebrated on the day on which they died and entered into Heaven. The feast of Sts. Louis and Zélie Martin is an exception to the rule. Their feast is celebrated on July 12, because it is the day on which they were civilly married, with a religious ceremony taking place at midnight on July 13, as was common for couples who wanted a quiet service where they could receive Communion. Their path to sainthood was as a married couple. Of the nine children they had, five grew to adulthood and entered convents. Their youngest, of course, is St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus. Their third child, Marie Léonie, is also a candidate for sainthood.

July 13 is the feast of St. Teresa of Jesus of the Andes. Juanita Fernandez Solar, entered the Carmelite Monastery in Los Andes in Chile. She was attracted to this Monastery because of its poverty, and was given the name Teresa of Jesus. Her life of sacrifice increased, and she found even greater joy than before: "I am the happiest person on earth. I desire nothing more because my entire being has been seized by God, who is Love." St. Teresa of Jesus of the Andes was canonized by Pope St. John Paul II in 1993. She is the first Chilean saint and is the patron of young people and the sick.

July 16 is, of course, the Solemnity of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Fr. Gabriel of St. Mary Magdalene, OCD, a revered authority on Carmelite spirituality, wrote that devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel means: a special call to the interior

life, which is preeminently a Marian life. Our Lady wants us to resemble her not only in our outward vesture but, far more, in heart and spirit. If we gaze into Mary's soul, we shall see that grace in her has flowered into a spiritual life of incalculable wealth: a life of recollection, prayer, uninterrupted oblation to God, continual contact, and intimate union with him. Mary's soul is a sanctuary reserved for God alone, where no human creature has ever left its trace, where love and zeal for the glory of God and the salvation of mankind reign supreme. Those who want to live their devotion to Our Lady of Mt. Carmel to the full must follow Mary into the depths of her interior life. Carmel is the symbol of the contemplative life, the life wholly dedicated to the quest for God, wholly orientated towards intimacy with God; and the one who has best realized this highest of ideals is Our Lady herself, "Queen and Splendor of Carmel".

July 17 Mother Therese of St. Augustine and Companions. The Martyrs of Compiègne were the 16 members of the Carmel of Compiègne, executed on July 17, 1794, during the French Revolution. The martyrs were proclaimed venerable in 1902 and were beatified in 1906. We are hoping that Pope Francis will soon proclaim them Saints in the near future!

July 20 marks the Feast of the great Prophet of God Elijah, Spiritual Father of all Carmelites. The first Carmelite hermits gathered by the 'Well of Elijah' on Mount Carmel, and regarded themselves as the 'sons of the prophet'. Although Carmelites no longer claims Elijah as literal 'founder' of our Order, the inspiration that was found in Elijah from the very beginnings of the Order so pervades its whole history that the prophet may deservedly be called the founder of the Carmelite ideal, the Spiritual Father of All Carmelites.

July 23 is the distinctly Discalced Carmelite Feast of Mary, Mother of Divine Grace. This feast concludes the octave of the Solemnity of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. We honor Mary as Our Lady, Mother of Divine Grace since she is the Mother of the Son of God, the Author of Grace. 'The Blessed Virgin Mary was eternally predestined, in the context of the Incarnation of the divine Word, to be the Mother of God. As decreed by divine Providence, she served on earth as the loving Mother of the divine Redeemer, His associate, uniquely generous, and the Lord's humble servant. She conceived, bore, and nourished Christ; presented Him to the Father in the Temple; and was united with Him in His suffering as He died on the cross. In a completely unparalleled way she cooperated, by her obedience, faith, hope and burning charity, with our Savior's work of restoring supernatural life to souls. For this reason she is Mother to us all in the order of grace' (Lumen Gentium, the Constitution on the Church, 61).

JULY 24 we celebrate the Blessed Martyrs of Guadalajara, Spain, Sisters Maria Pilar, Teresa and Maria Angeles. They were martyred on this date in 1936, after having given witness to their faith in Christ the King and offered their lives for the Church. They were beatified by St. John Paul II on March 29, 1987.

July 27 marks the Feast of St. Titus Brandsma, Priest and Martyr, who was killed by the Nazis in 1942. He was canonized by Pope Francis on May 15, 2022.

Finally Blessed John Soreth is celebrated on July 28. A General of the Carmelite Order he restored and encouraged religious observance and promoted the foundation of communities of nuns in the Order.

The Great Eucharistic Revival

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world" -JOHN 6:51. Our Bishops of the United States are calling for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. They believe that God wants to see a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and sent out in mission "for the life of the world."

These three years will culminate in the first National Eucharistic Congress in the United States in almost fifty years. Almost a hundred thousand Catholics will join together in Indianapolis for a once-in-a-lifetime pilgrimage toward the "source and summit" of our Catholic faith. We hope you will join us as we renew the Church by coming together with Catholics across the United States to encounter our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. St. Mary of the Hill Security Information

Almost every night on the evening news we hear of violence and protester's in our churches, schools and throughout our country. The security team at St. Mary of the Hill has been working on security measures for the last 3 years. They are in the process of getting cameras for the parking lot and entryways. They have installed doors that once locked no one can enter but parishioners can get out. We added the stained glass aesthetics on our windows to not only add to the beauty of our worship space, but to add an element of security as well. They block the visibility to who is in the worship space. We will enhance the ground level windows to prevent transparent viewing in the rooms. We are looking to increase the locations of first aid kits throughout the facility. Not only are we considering the violence, but we are looking at creating procedures on the elements, inside and outside of our building. Everything from the Plumbing, electrical, heating and cooling to fire or severe weather events.

At a recent Ushers meeting, the Catholic Mutual Insurance gave some simple suggestions for safety; the ushers will now do a perimeter check before each Mass, keeping only one door open before Mass and lock the doors 10 minutes after the Mass has begun (our parishioners can get out but no one can get in). The security team asks our parish family to do their part by attending Mass on time. Thank you for your consideration and we would also like to thank the security team and the ushers for their hard work keeping our parish family safe.



The weekend of May 21 & 22, we were pleased to have John Michalak speak at Masses about Biking for Babies. This year Aubrie Faust, another parishioner who we have supported the past few years, is not riding so we are happy that John is able to support this worthwhile cause. Thank you for living your faith so boldly.

"Imagine a world where women don't have to make choices out of fear or convenience, but rather feel empowered to make choices out of love and purpose. Imagine a society that embraces the immeasurable worth of every human life from conception to natural death. Imagine a world in which your unique gifts and talents help others to know and understand life as a treasure. My name is John Michalak and for the second year, Biking for Babies has invited me to take part in rebuilding the culture of life. This year I will have the honor of leading as well as riding alongside 10 missionaries from Minneapolis, MN to St. Louis, MO covering over 600 miles by bike from July 10-16. We are partnered with pregnancy resource centers that are helping mothers in crisis pregnancies. These centers provide free ultrasounds and pregnancy tests. They provide free clothing, diapers, and formula which we know is now harder than it has ever been in recent memory. They provide parenting classes from birth up until age 6, and so much more. These centers are on the front lines of rebuilding the culture of life, but they cannot do it alone.

This year is flying by and September is coming fast!

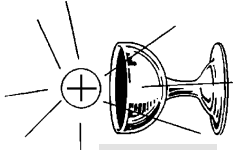
