Dear Parishioners.

Spring is here and what a beautiful time of year it is! The trees are leafing, the robins are back, and the snow has finally melted from our parking lot. It is also a time of reflection as we conclude this glorious Easter season. Hopefully, by next Easter, we will have a portion of our new church already built!

Speaking of our new church, I hope you all had an opportunity to attend one of the three reveal presentations for our new church. These were held in early April and we received many positive and enthusiastic comments from many of you. We also heard several excellent suggestions which our teams will work to incorporate where possible.

The design of our new worship space went from a "dedicated worship space" to a "new church" with the help of our new architect as well as our Building and Design teams. The new church design has a focus on Holy Hill through an expansive window. The wood plank ceiling draws your eye to the altar platform where the Eucharist will be prominently displayed under a large crucifix.

We will have a family friendly design where families are encouraged to worship together. A space has also been designed which will allow for a parent whose child may need to exit mass. This space will feature a large 4'x8' glass window that will face the altar platform allowing for the parent (and child) to continue to participate in the liturgy. External speakers will bring the mass to this space.

The new design has an additional entrance designed for those with mobility challenges to easily access the church from the handicapped designated parking area.

I had the opportunity to present the new design to the Carmelite community in early April and it was met with unanimous approval. In addition, the design was presented



to the archdiocese building committee in mid-April. Approval from the committee was delayed pending additional documents needed for their review. The final approval meeting with the archdiocese is scheduled for either August or October.

Our initial fund-raising drive concluded earlier this year and helped us raise a total of \$2.6M in cash on hand and pledges. Thank you for your kind generosity. We continue to need to close the funding gap as our new church is forecasted to cost approximately \$3.1M – leaving us approximately \$500,000 short at the present time. I appreciate your prayerful reflection on how you can assist us monetarily.

Finally, I want to thank all of you who have given thus far with your time, your talents, and/or treasure. This is OUR church and we have a great parish community rallied around making it a reality. Thank you for all of your prayers and to all those involved!! Our Lady of Good Success, Pray for us!

Updated Blue Print of Our New Church Area


