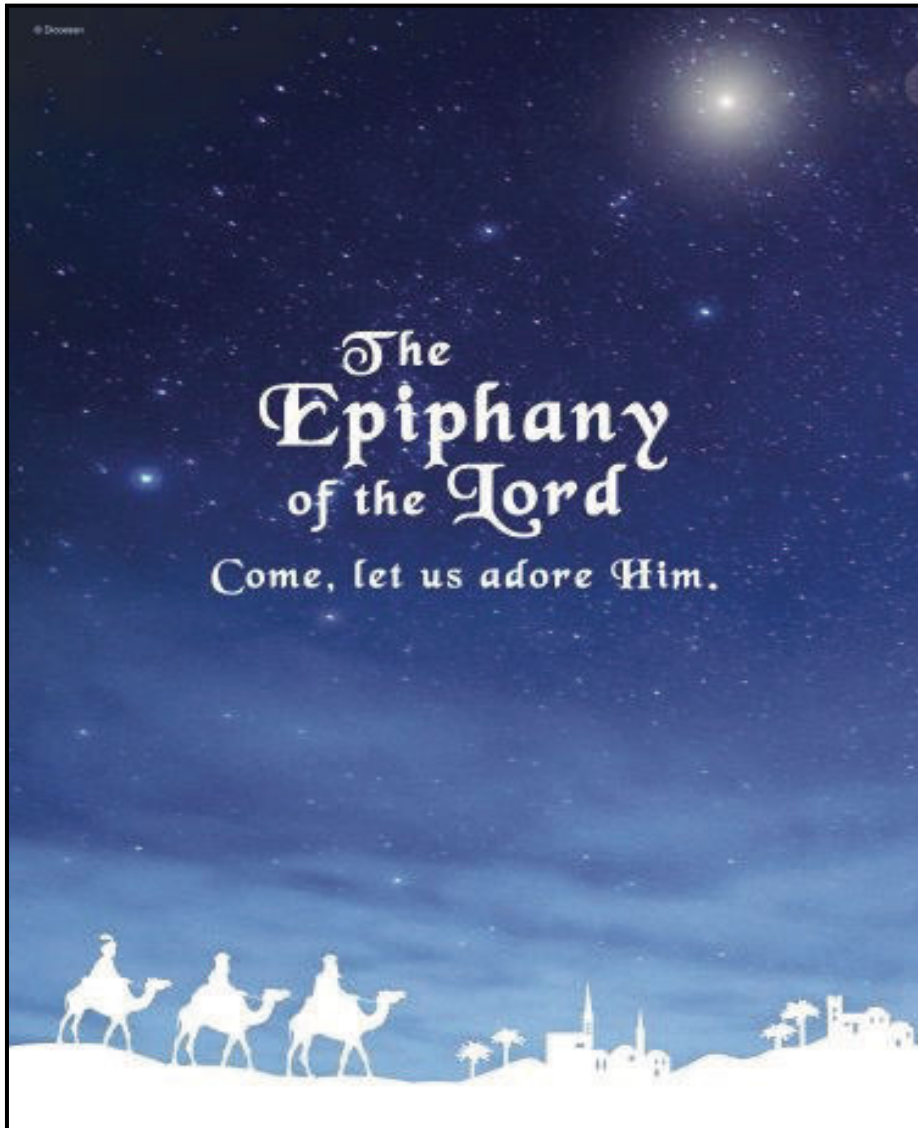

JANUARY 2, 2022—THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Happy Epiphany! Jesus is born, and the Magi from the East have come to pay him homage. What a tremendous mystery and a beautiful story to contemplate! St. Matthew's Gospel regularly highlights the theme that Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of all that God promised his people. In the very person of Jesus of Nazareth, all the prophecies and plans of God have come to completion. But what often happens throughout the Gospel, and especially in today's story of the Magi, is that this fulfillment always occurs in the most surprising ways.



These two themes of fulfillment and surprise, regarding God's plan in our lives, are foundational. God is always faithful to his promises. In God there is no contradiction. He is good, and all his ways are holy. God speaks into existence itself, and God never revokes his promises. But at the same time, God isn't easy for us to "figure out." He has his own ways of doing things. No matter how far along we are in our journey of knowledge and love of God, he always surprises us in his providence.

This theme comes to mind as we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord! This account actually couldn't be more surprising! Jesus is born to Israel, who has been waiting for this Savior for thousands of years. He is the fulfillment, the anointed King, in the line of David, born in Bethlehem, etc, etc, etc. And the first thing we hear is Herod the King and all of Jerusalem is troubled! Assembling the chief priests and scribes of Jewish people, King Herod begins to overthrow this new threat to his earthly power. The very people who were expecting and even knew Jesus would come this way immediately seek to destroy him.

So, one must ask: why did it happen that way? They were surprised! It didn't happen how they wanted it to. They weren't ready. It challenged their way of life and thinking. He asked of them things they were not willing to give up. And when he finally spoke of exactly that which was going to happen, they killed him.

But our God is a God of surprises. In fact, we get the impression that he purposely allows it to happen this way. Not that he wants us to be surprised to the point of trying to eliminate his only Son, but he does want us to be reminded that He is God, and we are not. He wants us to use the power of our freedom for the good; and to do this not just once in a while but all the time. This allows us to actually believe in God, who as I mentioned above never fails us in his promises.

God doesn't force belief on us. He isn't a "food pusher" in matters of faith or love. He offers us the opportunity to choose him in response to all of the goodness he has afforded us. This is precisely the beauty of the Magi from the East. They were open to God, and they chose to believe in Him whom they had heard about. They traveled a far distance, and when they finally arrived, they prostrated themselves before him in the most humble adoration possible. Again, notice the surprise! Not the people who had known and waited for him, but those on outside of "know/how" are the ones to truly adore Christ and offer him precious gifts.

I invite you to consider the ways you have God "already figured out," and then forget about them! Or rather, put them on the back burner and try to notice the ways that God is trying to reveal himself to you in a surprising, beautiful, and new way. It would be a shame to be caught by surprise, feeling angry, insecure, jealous, or prideful towards the King of the Universe knocking at the door of our heart. Instead, let us choose to believe like the Magi! Let us offer Christ the very best of ourselves and let us humbly acknowledge that what gives us is more and is better than anything we could ever imagine.

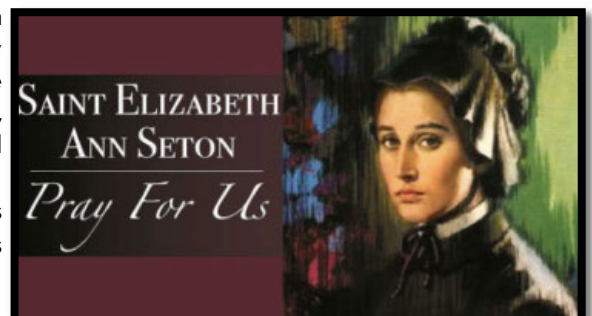

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton—Feast Day January 4

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."
