## JANUARY 9, 2022—THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

This solemnity gives each of us an opportunity to reflect upon our own baptism, and our identity, dignity, and mission as Christians.



When we were baptized, we were born into Christ's very life. Through it, we have become members of his body. The sacramental grace we've received allows us to share in the overabundant and divine love of the Most Holy Trinity.

As members of Christ's body, we have been claimed by God. We have been set apart, and made God's own. God has claimed us in baptism by bestowing upon us an indelible mark. This means our baptism is everlasting, and can never be repeated. Although the mark is invisible, it cannot be removed.

The indelible mark is the sign that we have been made members of Christ's body, and have been adopted as sons and daughters of God, just as Christ is the Son of God.

This share in Christ's life as His members gives us tremendous dignity, the dignity of sons and daughters of God. Our primary identity is now our relationship with God, as son or daughter. What an incredible identity, what an incredible gift!

As sharers in Christ's life, we have now also become sharers in Christ's person and His priesthood. Not only have we been given tremendous dignity, and a clear identity, but we have also been deputized to share in Christ's priesthood.

As sharers in Christ's priesthood, our primary mission is to offer right worship to God. We do this when we faithfully attend mass with our families, and when we fervently assist the priest by offering our whole hearts to be taken up into the sacrifice of the Eucharist. We do this by praying with our families at home, and sacrificing for our children and spouses. We do this by living virtuously, and living with grateful hearts, knowing that all we have received comes from Him, and so we offer all we have back to the Father out of love, just as Christ did.

The sacramental grace we receive at baptism is one we always have access to. They are always there, however, they are only activated when we are living faithfully. This means that in order to actualize the real identity, dignity, and mission with which we have been blessed, we must make regular use of the sacraments of confession the Eucharist. When we live a regular life of communion with God and others, these baptismal graces can flow freely, and we can fully participate in God's love, and allow it to spill over into our relationships at home, at work, and in our community.

We have been offered an incredible gift. This Sunday, let us thank God for such a gift. Let us strive to remember our dignity, live from our identity, and exercise our priestly role. Let us offer our lives back to the one who so generously bestowed them upon us.


