JANUARY 30, 2022—4TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parishioners,

Over Christmas, my brother-in-law shared with me a recent change of heart. He recalled a conversation he and I had a few years ago, where he said he believed there was no such thing as a selfless act. He thought that even when one acted rightly, these acts were always mixed with selfish interests. Now, he has changed his mind, and believes there are selfless acts, which could rightly be called "charitable".



Our second reading today focuses on charity. Charity is a theological virtue, which differentiates it from other human virtues. Where some virtues can be developed over time through intentional repeated action, the gift of charity is exactly that - it is a gift. And this gift can only come from God. Charity can be defined as love, as willing the good of the other.

As Zachary referenced in last week's bulletin, our seminary community went away on retreat two weeks ago. A takeaway from the retreat for me was the direct relationship of prayer to charity. In prayer, we are present to the one who is always present to us. And, as Christians, we believe in Jesus' power to transform us. As we give ourselves to Christ in our being present to Him, we allow Him to bestow the great gift of charity upon us. In this way, charity can be a helpful litmus test for us. If we see this virtue taking root in us, we can thank God. If not, we might ask ourselves if we have been attentive to Jesus, and to return to Him, believing that He can make us new, and can transform our hearts.

Perhaps we can ask ourselves if the love we hear in the second reading today corresponds to our experiences? Do we love like that? If not, we should not be surprised or ashamed. Without Christ, no one could possess this virtue. Rather than be shocked, we can resolve to do what is in our control to develop this love within us. And what is in our control? As Catholics, we have incredible recourse to the sacraments. We can confess our sins, and devoutly approach the Eucharist. Also, we can make the little decisions to be present to God in prayer, even if that can only happen on the drive into work, or early in the morning.

It is no coincidence that my brother-in-law's change of heart directly coincides with his greater attentiveness to God's presence in his life through prayer. Let us remember that what makes us unique as Christians is our relationship and trust in God. We can remember that He is for us, and that He wants to work in our lives. He is always present to us, and when we make ourselves present to Him, He can do amazing things. Among our primary duties as Christians is to be true believers. We believe that He can do all things, not just abstractly, but in our very own hearts and lives.







SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM - Preparation for the Sacrament of Baptism involves special instruction for the parents. Please call the parish office preferably before the child is born for more information and to schedule a Baptism. BAPTISM SPONSORS: According to Canon Law, the sponsor must be a practicing Catholic who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation, at least 16 years old, active member of their parish and if married, they must be in a sacramental (valid) marriage. If two sponsors are chosen, there should be one male and one female. BAPTISM CLASS: If this is your first child OR there is a three-year gap from when you first took the class, both parents are required to attend the Baptism class. The Godparents are encouraged to attend if they are able. Baptism Classes are held every third Sunday of the month in the Holy Trinity café from 8:15 a.m. - 10:45 a.m. Continental breakfast is provided. Daycare may be available upon request. Registration deadline is the Tuesday before the class.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE – Contact the parish at least six months in advance of the anticipated wedding date. Couples should refrain from setting a firm date until they have talked to the Priest to discuss Marriage plans. At least one of the parties must be a registered, practicing Catholic member of our parish.
