There are couple scripture passages from this weekend I would like to comment on. First, the last verse in the Gospel this week says of Jesus, "He was amazed at their lack of faith." He said this in reference to the reaction and response He received from his own neighbors when He returned and preached at the synagogue. When I read that verse I always think of the times those words could be applied to me. Might Jesus be equally surprised at the lack of faith we sometimes show? What can we do differently to overcome our lack of faith? So often it is our unwillingness to give God complete control over our lives. It is that we hold on to something for ourselves rather than let go and trust in Him. One powerful prayer that we can say is, "Lord I believe. Help my unbelief." Pray this again and again. God will not let you down if you are honestly seeking him. Second, In the Epistle, St. Paul talks about a thorn in his flesh. What is that thorn he is talking about? We don't know. St. Augustine thought it to be a painful physical illness. Whereas St. John Chrysostom thought the thorn to refer to the suffering caused to Paul from his continuous harassment and beatings he endured. Whereas St. Gregory the Great was of the opinion that Paul spoke of the thorn in reference to temptations which he finds particularly difficult to resist. How many of us also have a thorn in our flesh? Either some form of physical suffering or some sin or temptation we struggle to overcome. Some of these "thorns" if we are intentional about it with God's help we can overcome. Others will stay, but with God's help we can almost get used to them, persevere and be stronger for it. When Paul realized that his cross wouldn't go away he accepted it saying: "I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints for the sake of Christ. For when I am weak, then I am strong." These are great words for us to say and repeat over and over again.




