PASTOR'S CORNER



My name is Fr. Tonny Kizza, born on July 31st, 1976, a Muganda from Buddu County, Buganda Kingdom, Blessed Sacrament-Kimaanya Catholic Parish in Masaka Diocese, in the People's Republic of Uganda, (the Pearl of Africa) the land of the Uganda Martyrs in Eastern Africa.

I am the second of six children; my mother is still alive. I grew up and was

raised Catholic; all the families I grew up with went for Mass mostly on Sundays and prayed the Rosary almost every night. I am grateful for this orientation.

I completed my grade school at St. John's Kabuwoko Boys' school in 1991, then joined Kabuwoko secondary school, completing my high school at St. John's secondary school in 1998.

Then I joined Nkozi Teacher training college where in the year 2000, I completed a Diploma in secondary education with History and Religious education as my teaching subjects. At all levels of my education, I was always interested in music, dance and drama; in my 5th grade during the fundraising drive to build our school, I led the school Choir in a song where the guest of honor: Mr. Kasamba (R.I.P.) donated to the school 65 Iron sheets (tinned Roof).

In 2001 I joined Philosophy Centre Jinja (PCJ) but then left to pursue a bachelor's degree in social sciences at Kampala University, completing it in 2004.

In 2008 I joined Uganda Martyrs University, the only university in Uganda which lies on the Equator, to complete a Master of Development Degree in 2010. And in 2014 I went back to the same University to do a Master of Public health majoring in Health promotion, but I only completed one year, before joining St. Francis de Sales Seminary here in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, to pursue priesthood, the call I had had since I was about 10 years old.

The idea to be a priest became somewhat clearer when I participated in the Eucharistic procession for the first time; and when the Presider carrying the Lord passed by me, I felt something different; from that time I developed the special desire for the Lord and to become a priest. Growing up with my grandmother (R.I.P.) who was a devoted Catholic, she would sometimes tell me she wanted me to become a priest, but I trust we both didn't have a clear picture what this meant! And sometimes I would hear her praying that God may give her a priest in her Family.

My first professional job was teaching which I did for 1 year at St. John's S.S.S Kabuwoko, then I joined social work in HIV healthcare - Hospitals for 10 years. Served with Uganda Cares - AHF, Villa Maria AIDS Home care, Joint Clinical Research Center and The Mildmay Uganda respectively. I also coordinated HIV//AIDS Research projects for 8 years.

I am a founding member of JJAJJA'S Care Project; (https://www.jjajjacare.com) an organization supporting the poor, the vulnerable kids and youths, widows and the people living with HIV in Uganda.

One might think that my life has been a success all through, but surely, I have lost so many battles including the failure to resist God's call to the priesthood. When I left the seminary, I became vigilant in fighting God's persistent voice to priesthood but I lost the fight and resorted to paying attention to this call in prayers thus God pulled me back to the seminary and I am happy to be a priest, glad to be assigned to St Monica and St Eugene Parishes where my major task in my first years of priesthood is "to learn to be a priest." I ask God to help me to do it well.

The One Minute Catechism: The Eucharist - Part VI (CCC 1322-1419) We now consider some vital truths about the Eucharist. First, we should understand that the Mass is a sacrifice. It is a sacrifice because when the Church celebrates the Eucharist, Jesus Christ makes His saving, sacrificial death present sacramentally to us through the actions of the priest. The Church offers the Eucharistic sacrifice to adore and thank God, to pray for all our needs, and to gain pardon for our sins. The priest links the consecration of the Eucharist to the Last Supper and Christ's sacrifice on the Cross. As a result, the sacrifice of Christ becomes the sacrifice of all the members of the Church. Our lives, our prayers, sufferings, and works gain a new value because they are united with Christ and with His total sacrifice. The offering of Christ also unites the members of the Church here on earth as well as those in heaven.

Second, the Mass is a Holy Meal that culminates in our receiving Jesus Christ's Body and Blood under the form of bread made from wheat and wine made from grapes. We must prepare conscientiously to participate in this Holy Meal. We must be in the state of grace to receive the Eucharist. Accordingly, we must always examine our consciences to determine our worthiness to receive Communion. This examination includes assessing whether we have sinned and whether we have been faithful to the moral teachings of the Church in our personal and public lives. If we are conscious of having committed a mortal sin, we cannot receive Communion until we are absolved from that sin in the Sacrament of Penance. We must also fast from food or drink for at least one hour prior to the reception of Holy Communion. As St. Paul teaches, "[W]hoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the Body and Blood of the Lord...For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the Body, eats and drinks judgment on himself." (1 Cor 11:27, 29).

Reflect: The Eucharistic sacrifice also reminds us of the importance of sacrifice in our daily lives. In a willful, self-centered culture where people are taught to do whatever they feel like and to give only when they gain something in return, the sacrifices each of us make in imitation of Christ help to show the reality and power of God's love.

Pray: May the Most Blessed Sacrament be forever praised and adored.
