
THE TWO GREAT COMMANDMENTS

Today's liturgy reminds us of one of the greatest truths in the Bible, that there are really only two commandments. The first is to love God, and the second is to love our neighbor. They are not meant to be separated. But we often do separate them. We like to think that we are on good terms with God, yet how many of us can say that we are on good terms with our neighbors? We speak to God when we pray, but do we speak to all our neighbors? Let us ask the Father to forgive us our failures to prove our love for him by loving our brothers and sisters.

1st READING (Deut. 6:2-6). Moses reminds the people of the great commandments to love God. To love God means to keep his commandments and to walk in his ways.

2nd READING (Hebrews 7:23-28). This reading shows the superiority of Christ over the priests of the Old Testament.

GOSPEL (Mark 12:28-34). All of God's commandments can be reduced to two.



All Souls Day is a solemn feast in the Church commemorating all of those who have died and now are in Purgatory, being cleansed of their venial sins and the temporal punishments for the mortal sins that they had confessed and atoning before entering fully into Heaven.

On All Souls Day, we not only remember the dead, but we apply our efforts, through prayer, almsgiving, and the Mass, to their release from Purgatory. There is a **plenary indulgence** attached to All Souls Day, for visiting a church or for visiting a cemetery.

(The plenary indulgence for visiting a cemetery can also be obtained every day from November 1-8, and, as a partial indulgence, on any day of the year.) While the actions are performed by the living, the merits of the indulgences are applicable only to the souls in Purgatory. **Praying for the dead is a Christian charity and obligation.** In the case of our parents, to do so should not be simply a duty but a joy. They gave us life and brought us up in the Faith; we should be happy that our prayers can help end their sufferings in Purgatory and bring them fully into the light of Heaven. In the modern world, when many have come to doubt the Church's teaching on Purgatory, the need for such prayers has only increased. The Church devotes the month of November to prayer for the Holy Souls in Purgatory, and **participation in the Mass of All Souls Day is a good way to begin the month.**


