

DOING OUR WINTER WORK

As we begin Advent we naturally think of the coming of Christ. We live between two comings of Christ—his first coming in humility and weakness, and his second coming in majesty and power.

With each passing year, as St. Paul says, 'our salvation is nearer than when we first believed.' Let us reflect for a moment on how much we need the Lord's salvation in our lives and in the world.

The Lord lives on in his Church. Let us turn to him with confidence, asking him to make the salvation he won for us a reality.

You bring us wisdom, fresh understanding and new vision. Lord, have mercy.

You bring us the good news, and the power which will transform our lives. Christ, have mercy.

You bring us the truth, showing us the way to eternal life. Lord, have mercy.

1st READING (Jeremiah 33:14-16). The prophet says that a time will come when God will be true to his promise. The Son of David (that is, The Messiah) will stand among his people. His reign will be marked by wisdom, justice and integrity.

2nd READING (1 Thess. 3:12-4:2). Paul prays that the Lord may deepen the love the Thessalonians have for each other, a love that will then reach out to all people. This they will be ready for the second coming of Christ.

GOSPEL (Luke 21:25-28, 34-36). In language borrowed from the Old Testament Luke describes the final coming of Christ. Christians should not fear this. Rather, they should look forward to it and prepare for it through prayer and right living.
