THE LORD IS AT THE DOOR

In a few days we celebrate the birthday of Christ our Savior. We are asked to prepare our hearts to receive him like Mary did. She will help us. Let us turn to her.

Christ came most readily to those who had most need of him, that is to the unfortunate, the sinful, the destitute - those who were 'empty'. Let us come to him in our sinfulness and emptiness.

Shepherd of Israel, you rouse your might and come to our help. Lord, have mercy.

1st READING (Micah 5:1-4). Jerusalem was under siege and David's dynasty was in jeopardy. But the prophet said that salvation would come from a comparatively insignificant place—Bethlehem. From there a new leader would come to gather together the scattered exiles and unite the nation once more.

2nd READING (Hebrews 10:5-10). The sacrifices of the Mosaic Law were unable to purify people from sin. Only Christ, through his obedience and sacrifice of self, was able to bring about the reconciliation between God and his people.

GOSPEL (Luke 1:39 -45). This deals with Mary's visit to Elizabeth. Enlightened by the Holy Spirit, Elizabeth praises Mary and hints at the uniqueness of the child she has just conceived.

Midnight Mass






