1st READING (Jeremiah 17:5-8). The life of those who trust in man is as precarious as that of a shrub growing in the desert. Whereas the life of those who trust in God is as sure as that of a tree growing by the waterside.

2nd READING (1 Cor 15:12, 16-20). The resurrection of Christ is the foundation on which our faith and hope rest.

GOSPEL (Luke 6:17, 20-26). This contains Luke's version of the Beatitudes. (Whereas Matthew has nine beatitudes, Luke has only four, with however four corresponding 'woes').

THE WORLD OF THE BEATITUDES

The Gospel of today's Mass plunges us into the world of the Beatitudes. Here we discover the values Christ held up before his disciples. They are so different from those which are accepted as desirable by ordinary sensible people that they take us into a new world.

Which world do we belong to? For instance, when making important decisions, do we ever consult Christ and his Gospel?

Lord, Jesus, you teach us that we become truly rich not by receiving but by giving. Lord, have mercy.

Lord, Jesus, you teach us that the greatest person is not the one who is served but the one who serves. Christ, have mercy.

Lord Jesus, you help us to find peace of soul not by doing what is popular or profitable but what is right. Lord, have mercy.




