

When we think of the word *epiphany*, we think of a moment of revelation. But the birth of Christ is more than a revelation, it is a revolution, a moment in which the old order is overthrown.

Christ's coming wasn't all shepherds quaking and angels singing—it was a serious threat to those with worldly power. Herod was willing to go to extremes to suppress him, ordering the slaughter of all male infants just to be sure. In what ways does Jesus challenge you?

EPIPHANY

The wise men came searching for Christ. They found him, worshipped him and offered him gifts. Since then millions of people have followed in their footsteps and come to Christ. We are doing just that this morning. We come to Christ to worship him and offer him our gifts.

But Christ is no longer a helpless baby. He is our Lord and Savior who enriches us.

Lord Jesus, you bring healing to the sick. Lord, have mercy.

Lord Jesus, you bring forgiveness to sinners. Christ, have mercy.

Lord Jesus, you give us yourself to heal us and bring us strength. Lord, have mercy.

1st READING (Isaiah 60:1-6). The exiles returned from Babylon to find their beloved Jerusalem in ruins. The prophet cheers them up with a vision of a restored city.

2nd READING (Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6). Paul reveals the fact that God invites all, Jews and Gentiles alike, to share on an equal footing the salvation won by Christ.

GOSPEL (Matthew 2:1-12). This relates how three strangers came from a far country to pay homage to the Christ child while the Jewish leaders rejected him.

We are told that the Magi were led to Christ by the light of a bright star. Often, however, it is not through an experience of light, but of darkness, that people discover Christ.

This should not really surprise us. The fact is, we cannot see the stars in the bright light of day, but only in the darkness of night, and the darker the night, the brighter they shine.

Just as the stars continue to shine even when we cannot see them, so the Lord's light is always there, though it is sometimes hidden from us by clouds, clouds of confusion, distraction, and unbelief.



Everyone needs a star to follow, just as ships at sea need a lighthouse beacon to guide then to port. From now on we have a star that will not deceive us, we have a compass that will not lie to us.

You, Lord, are the star that will guide us until the lights of the eternal port appear on the horizon.

The royal metal; signifies **Jesus' Kingship** (hence, the gift for a king).

FRANKINCENSE

Symbol of prayer; signifies Jesus as the High Priest/Mediator between God and man (hence, the gift for a priest).

MYRRH

A burial ointment; meaning that **Jesus had to** die for the salvation of all (hence, gift for one who would die).


