OUR INNER SINS

Many people who confess their sins, confess only the things they have done wrong. But Christ tells us that we can sin even if we never have done the external act. GOSPEL (Matthew 5:17-37). The Scribes and Pharisees were considered to be models of virtue. Yet Christ said: 'Unless your virtue goes deeper than that of the Scribes and Pharisees, you will not see the Kingdom of Heaven.'

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass (3) <u>Why is the Mass a Sacrifice?</u>

Have you ever wondered why Holy Mass is called a "sacrifice" and why the prayers of the Mass contain sacrificial language? It all goes back to what God the Father asks of us. In other words, just as He obliged us to worship



Him, He also gave Moses exact instructions as to how we are to worship Him.

Going back to the Book of Genesis, not only is a lamb (provided by God) sacrificed in place of Isaac at the hands of Abraham (c.f. Genesis 22:1-19), but later in Salvation History, God commands Moses to have the chosen people sacrifice unblemished lambs, each family placing the blood of the lamb on the doorpost and lintels of their homes, in order to be spared the final plague in Egypt (c.f. *Exodus 12:1-32*). Lastly, God gives Moses the Laws about sacrifice, which will be carried out by a priesthood in a Temple (c.f. Exodus 20 ff). These sacrifices will culminate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, where the "Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world" (John 1:29), will be sacrificed in an unbloody manner by


a priesthood in a Church, on an altar. But why sacrifice? Simply put, in the Ancient Near East, the penalty for

breaking a covenant was death. Once Adam and Eve broke their covenant with God, death was sure to



follow: "...for in the day that you eat of it you shall die" (*Genesis 2:17*). This is where the greatest act of Love that has ever been, steps into the breech and sacrifices Himself on our behalf, so that we might not die, but have life eternal. And it is this great act of sacrificial love, that is re-presented at every single Catholic Mass. (**to be continued**)
