#### THE TRANSFIGURATION: A PEAK EXPERIENCE

On Mount Tabor Christ's disciples got a glimpse of the glory that was his as the Son of God. Here we get a glimpse of our own glory, for we too are children of the Father. This should fill our lives with hope and meaning.

It is good for us to be here. Let us turn to Christ, our Brother, who prays to the Father with us.

# The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass (6) "Dress in Your Sunday Best!"

For those of us who used to frequent the movie theaters, we remember a message that used to come up before the start of the movie: "Silence is Golden!" It was a gentle reminder of the need to respect our neighbor by not talking during the movie. But if silence is golden in a movie theater, how much more precious and necessary is silence in the house of God, where people come not to be entertained, but to converse with the Living God?

Silence, generally speaking, is no longer ap-



preciated by modern man. In fact, if we're honest with ourselves, silence scares the living daylights out of us. Why? Because in silence we are forced to face our real selves—those ugly parts of us

that we'd rather didn't exist. But even more threatening to us than our own brokenness, are the pangs of our conscience for not fully observing God's commands, and not allowing Him to reign as King of our hearts and of our lives. We are more like Adam and Eve who after sinning, hid from the Father as He walked through the garden. We've individually and collectively lost our trust in the fact that God is a good Father and that He wants our good!

But our constant need for noise comes at a high price! Robert Cardinal Sarah, former Prefect of the Congrega-



tion for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, lamented that "Our world no longer hears God because it is constantly speaking, at a devastating speed and volume, in order to say nothing" (*The Power of Silence*). In other words, God can't get a word in edgewise! We are so busy talking and being entertained by the things of this passing world, that the only One who truly knows us and loves us—God the Father—is not permitted to speak His wisdom into our lives nor His loving words of consolation into our wounded hearts! Insightful observation from a wise man.

This is why when we enter into the Church—into God's own house—we silence our lips and our tongue, that He might converse with us and we with Him. Not only does this practice do good for our own soul, but for the souls of everyone else in the Church. Truth be told, the church is nearly the only place left in this noisy world, where God's children can come converse with their Father who delights in them, and receive the wisdom and guidance they need to become who He created them to be. Let us respect God and neighbor by being silent in the House of God!


